

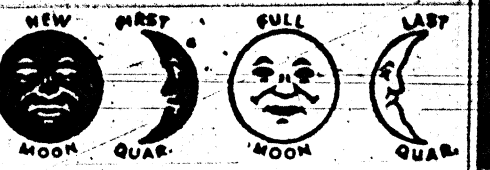

# ANNOUNCES OF SOIL BANK SIGNUP

Acres Reserve  
Allowed To Stop  
Of Congress  
Short Session

There will be no sign-up this year for additional land or conservation on the soil bank contracts, since congress has not authorized extension of the program, according to Roy Wright, chairman of the Clarke county soil bank committee.

Contracts which expire later are no longer eligible for extension for an additional period of years.

Wright explained that the soil bank act of 1956 authorized the secretary of agriculture was to enter into conservation contracts with farmers during the five-year period ending 6-60.

Sign-up under the 1960 act was held last fall, so farmers would know in advance of the cropping season whether their land would be added to the conservation reserve. The authorization for new contracts has not been renewed, there will be no sign-up this fall.

Farmers should understand that the existing contracts for 1960 and previous years are still in effect and payments will continue to be made for the period of the contract.

## Minor Stansell Died Sept. 8

### Former Osceola Attorney and Representative Died At California Home

Minor R. Stansell, former Osceola attorney and one time state representative from Clarke county, died at Los Angeles, Calif., Sept. 8. Services were held in "Church of the Hills" in Los Angeles, Tuesday, Sept. 13, and burial was in Forest Lawn Hollywood Hills cemetery.

Stansell was born near New Virginia on July 9, 1886, a son of Adeline Roach and Frank K. Stansell. He received his education in the New Virginia schools and came to Osceola early in the century where he was employed in the telephone business, being at the time of resignation in 1918 district manager for the Bell Telephone Co.

He studied law under the late Henry Stivers and practiced law in Osceola for some 20 years. He was Clarke county attorney from 1923 to 1927 and state representative in 1933 and 1934. He served on the Osceola school board for five years.

He was married to Lenora Wade in 1911. Two children were born to them, Norris Wade Stansell of Los Angeles and Mrs. John Harsh of Columbus, Ohio.

Besides his widow and children, he is survived by two sisters, Mrs. Lula Tallman of Maywood, Calif., and Elvina Proudfoot Wyss; and four grandchildren, David A. Stansell, Dick Stansell and Terry and Tim Harsh.

The family moved to Los Angeles in 1937 where he practiced law until his death in 1959.

## Minor Roach Stansell

Minor Roach Stansell, son of Adeline Roach and Frank K. Stansell, was born in Clarke county, near the town of New Virginia, Iowa, on July 8, 1886, and died in Los Angeles, Calif., September 8, 1960.

He received his education in the New Virginia public schools. Moved to Osceola, where he was in the employ of the Bell Telephone Company for a period of fourteen years, being district area manager at the time of his resignation in May, 1918. In 1914 he took up the study of law under the late Henry Stivers, former publisher of the Des Moines Leader. He passed the state bar examination in October, 1925, and followed in general practice of law in Osceola for the next twenty years. He was a member of the board of education in Osceola for five years,

the last four years of which he served as president. He was elected county attorney in 1923 and re-elected in 1925, and was State Representative in Iowa in 1933 and 1934.

In 1937 he moved to Los Angeles, Calif., where he passed the state bar and was active in his practice of law for the next 22 years, retiring in September, 1959.

He was an active member in the Masonic lodge, a Past Master. He was affiliated with the I. O. O. F. and the Knights of Pythias, and with the Methodist Episcopal church.

He was married in 1911 to Lenora Wade, and from this union two children were born, Norris Wade Stansell of Los Angeles, and Mrs. John Mars of Columbus, Ohio.

Those surviving, besides his wife and children, are two sisters, Lula Tailman of Maywood, Calif., and Elvina Proudfoot Wyss and four grandchildren,

David A. Stansell, Dick Stansell, and Terry and Tim Marsh.

Funeral services were held at noon, Tuesday, September 13 in the Church of the Hills and burial was in Forest Lawn Hollywood Hills cemetery.
