Representatives of the two countries clashed in the Generai Assembly's 21-nation Steering Committee, which was drafting the agenda for the current session. Each blamed the other for the collapse of the Geneva talks on a nuclear test ban.

Still opposed to admitting the Peiping regime, the United States has agreed only to assembly debate on the issue.

The Red China issue was one of several serious cold war disputes that cropped up either on the agenda or in the background almost as soon as the assembly met Tuesday. Among others are Berlin, disarmament and the fu--re of the United Nations Itself.
