Pearl Johnson, 66 Dies in Creston

Pearl E. Johnson, 66 (brother of Harold Johnson, of rural Afton, passed away at his home in Creston at 10 p. m. Sunday.

Funeral services were held at 2 p. m. Wednesday at the Cromwell Congregational church, with Rev. Ross O. Shinn officiating. Burial was in the Lorimer cemetery.

Pearl Ellert Johnson was born in Clarke county, February 7, 1901, the son of Henry and Mattie Keys Johnson. He was married in Creston in 1922 to Gertrude Bullock, who survives him. He had been farming until his retirement in 1956.

Survivors include his widow; two sons, Dean of Norwalk and Donald of Basehor, Kansas; and five brothers, George and Marshall of Creston; True of Cromwell; Lloyd of Lorimer and Harold of Afton.

Frank D. Ickis, 94 Dies Monday

Frank D. Ickis, 94 passed away at his rural home at 11:45 p. m. Monday, following a month's illness. He had lived in the same house on R. 2, Creston, for the last 92 years.

Funeral services are tentatively scheduled for Friday afternoon

at the First Baptist Church in Creston, with burial in Graceland cemetery.

Frank D. Ickis was born at Afton, Dec. 12, 1872, the son of A. F. and Ella R. Pott Ickis. He was married in Highland township, June 3, 1896, to Grace Bowman, who preceded him in death Nov. 10, 1964.

Mr. Ickis was a former state senator, serving from 1926 to 1932. He was one of the group that organized the Farmers Co-operative Company of Creston in 1918, serving several years on its board of directors and as treasurer. He was a charter member of the Union County Farm Bureau.

Survivors include a son, Ralph B. Ickis of Des Plaines, Ill.; two daughters, Mrs. E. J. (Gertrude) Moore of Pompano Beach, Fla.; and Mrs. Margaret Fauver of R. 2 Creston; six grandchildren and seven great grandchildren.
