
Lines Shut; George Kern, After Bla Attorney, 48, Is Dead Here

George A. Kern, 48, widelyknown Des Moines attorney and Republican, died unexpectedly, at his home early Monday morning.

Kern was stricken with a heart attack about 1 a. m. and died about an hour later after a doc-

tor had been called. The Kern home is at 4327 Greenwood drive.

Kern had suffered a heart attack while on a hunting trip last fall, but had been in apparent good health recently. He had worked daily at his office in the Bankers Trust



Co. building since Jan. 1.

Kern held only one elective public office—a term in Iowa house of representatives—but he had long been active in Republican party affairs in Iowa.
