One Of County's Most Active Re- sidents; He Was 72 Years Old

As it must to all men, death came to Wesley C. Lowe, Sunday, March 7, after an extended illness. Thursday afternoon his friends and neighbors paused to pay their last respects to him as one of Clarke county's best loved and most highly respected elder citizen. A leader in civic and political affairs, he was long regarded as one of the best informed men in the county on matters pertaining to the county and state.

His services were sought in nearly every important matter facing his community. As county auditor, state senator, member of the Clarke county Farm Bureau, he gave unselfishly of his time and energy for the good of his county.

Services were held from the Webster Funeral Home Thursday, March 11, with Rev. John L. McCurdy, pastor of the Christian church in Weldon officiating. in the Chaney cemetery in Green Bay township.

Wesley Chaney Lowe, son of Uriel and Clara Lowe, was born May 14, 1875 on a farm near Weldon in Clarke county, Iowa, where he grew to manhood and here he continued to make him hime until after the death of his parents, when he moved to Weldon and supervised his farming activities from there.

He served as Clarke county auditor from 1907 until 1911. In 1928 he was elected state senator and served in that capacity for four years.

On the 25th of December, 1898 he was united in marriage to Miss Florence Eddy of Leslie, Iowa. To this union were born three children: Lois Ellen Fairall of Deming, New Mexico, Ora Brierly of Weldon and Uriel Wendell Lowe of Webster City, Iowa.

He had been in failing health for a number of years, causing him to curtail his activities in many ways. For the past three months he was considered in a critical condition and on March 1 was brought to the hospital in Osceola for the last time where he passed away at 3 o'clock Sunday afternoon, March 7, 1948, at the age of 72 years, 9 months and 22 days.

He became a member of the Church of Christ at an early age and always endeavored to live a Christian life.

He leaves to mourn their loss his widow and the three children mentioned above; a foster sister, Mrs. Minnie Lillard of Rosemeade, California; five grandchildren, Jack, Ben and William Garnett Fairall; Florence Lucille and Wendell Charles Brierly, who with other relatives and many friends love and revere his memory.
