Sylvester Fleming, better known as Ves. was born on a farm south of Arbor Hill, Harrison Township, Adair County, Iowa October 4, 1874 and passed away Tuesday noon, June 11, 1963, at the Adair Memorial hospital County Greenfield. Mr. Fleming had been a patient in the hospital in Greenfield, since January 24, this year.
