Fairman L.W. Hall Overtaken By Death

Lyle W. Hall, 86, dean of Iowa fair secretaries and secretary of the Wapello County Fair since 1923, died Saturday, June 13, at 12:30 p.m. at St. Joseph Hospital in Ottumwa.

He was born September 22, 1883 in LaSalle County, Ill., the son of John and Sarah Pool Hall, but spent most of his life in the Eldon community where he was a farmer.

The horse and buggy were still a common means of transportation when Hall began his duties as the Eldon fair secretary. He attended his first Association in Des Moines in 1922 as a voting delegate from Wapello County.

He was elected director of the association in 1933 and in 1963 was presented the first "Fairman of the Year" award by the association. Hall was an avid horse racing fan and held the position of secretary of the Midwest Racing Circuit for many years.

He served in the state legislature in 1927 as Wapello County representative and was a staunch Republican.

Active in community affairs, he served on the County Board of Education in the early '30s. He was a member of the Congregational Church in Eldon, a 50-year member of the Masonic New Hope Lodge 480, and a 50-year member of the Zerephath Consistory No. 4 in Davenport.

His marriage to Orlow McGroery took place May 2, 1905. She died July 13, 1966. Survivors include one daughter of
