L. W. HATTER, MILLERSBURG DIED SUDDENLY DEC. 23.

L. W. Hatter, 83, of Millersburg
died suddenly Thursday afternoon,
December 23. Mr. Hatter operated
the Hatter Drug store in Millersburg
for many years; was a former cash-
ier of the Millersburg Savings Bank;
a former Iowa county represent-
ative in the state legislature and
served two terms as treasurer of
Iowa County.

Funeral services were conducted
at the Methodist church in Millers-
burg Sunday afternoon in charge of
Rev. Claude R. Cook of Marengo as-
sisted by the Rev. J. C. Davis of
Millersburg. Interment was in the
Millersburg cemetery.

On July 28, 1880, Mr. Hatter was
united in marriage at Millersburg
to Jessie May Rankin. They became
the parents of 10 children, four of
whom, Orville E., Mrs. Elva Bauer,
Gail and and infant daughter pre-
ceded their father in death. Mrs.
Hatter was claimed by death Dec-
ember 3, 1919.

Among those who survive are
two sons, M. K. Hatter of Ottawa,
Ill., and Ward R. Hatter of Marengo;
four daughters, Mrs. Ruth McCallis-
ter of Williamsburg, Mrs. Gladys
Bauer and Mrs. Edna Tripses of Mil-
lersburg and Mrs. Edith Thomas of
Mobridge, So. Dak.; and one sister,
Mrs. Delphia Miller of Ottumwa, 17
grandchildren and two great grand-
children.
