These travels enabled him ac uire many wonderful art treasures, with which he adorned his beautiful home in Daven-William Renwick first married, in 1855, Onthia Seymour, of Davenport. She diel in 1877. In 1879 he married Pame'a Helen Goodwin. She was a descendant of the Field family Western Massachusetts and of Capt. Elisha Hollister, who was a member of the committee decorrespondence in the war of the Revolution. Mrs. Renwick for some years had been engage! militerary work as assistant editor for Dr. J. H. Vincent, later bishop of the Methodist Church, in his noted Berean publications.

In the male line the only living representatives of the Renwick family are William Goodvin Renwick, who was Lorn at Berlin, January 10, 1886, and now lives in Boston, and his son, William Goodwin Renwick II.

Miss Rebecca Renwick is one of the best loved women of Davenport. She has spent nearly all ber life in one house, a house put up by her lather sixty years ago, at the corner of Fifteenth and Brady streets, one of the choice homes of the older generation, surrounded with great trees, life has been a benediction to many people.

CHARLES RHINEHART, who was born and reared m Dallas County, is a representative of one of its sterling pioneer families, and is today one of the progressive and successful exponents of stricultural and live stock industry in the county in which he was reared to manhood. He has ther substantial investments, but his major interest, as he is pleased to state, is that of stowing grains and marketing the same through the medium of live stock.

Mr. Rhinehart was born on the parental home farm in Sugar Grove Township, Dallas County, March 4, 1876, and is a son of George L. and

Adaline (Albin) Rhinehart, both of whom were born in the State of Indiana and both of whom were young folks when their respective families moved by covered wagons to Iowa. George L. Rhinehart and Miss Adaline Albin became residents of this state in 1853 and 1858, respectively, and they were married June 29, 1869.

George L. Rhinehart represented the Hawkeye State as a soldier of the Union in the Civil On his eighteenth birthday he went to Des Moines and enlisted as a member of the Fourth Iowa Battery, under command of Capt. P. H. Goode, and served until the close of the war, when he received an honorable discharge. He then returned to the home in Dallas County, in which county he and his wife resided from the time of their marriage until the close of their Mr. Rhinehart was long one of the subctantial farmers of Dallas County. He was a loyal and enterprising citizen, and an active, staunch supporter of the cause of the Republican party. He was affiliated with the Grand Army of the Republic, and was a Mason, a Knight Templar and a Noble of the Mystic Shrine. and his wife were earnest members of the Presbyterian Church. The death of Mrs. Rhinehart occurred June 30, 1912, and that of her husband, June 3, 1916. Their remains were laid to rest in the Masonic Cemetery at Dallas Center. Clement, first born of the children, died at the age of three years; Charles, of this review, was next in order of birth; Estella is now a resicient of Pomona, California.

Charles Rhinehart supplemented his elementary education of the country and town schools by attending normal and business schools in Shenandoah, Iowa, and Lincoln, Nebraska. In 1895 he entered the Iowa State College, at Ames, and pursued the courses in agriculture and animal husbandry until his graduation as a member of the class of 1899.

On February 14, 1906, occurred the marriage of Mr. Rhinehart and Miss Frances B. Schamel, who likewise was born and reared in Dallas County. Henry M. Schamel, father of Frances B. Schamel, was the owner of valuable farm property in Dallas County and was also engaged in the buying and shipping of grain. Mrs. Rhinehart advanced her high school education by attending Grinnell College, and graduated with the class of 1899. She is still actively interested in the cultural affairs of the community. Helen Louise, elder of the two children of Mr. and Mrs. Rhinehart, was born April 22, 1907. She graduated from the high school in Dallas Center. She completed a liberal arts course in Grinnell College in 1929, and followed it by a year in the Simmons College School of Secretarial Study in Boston, Massachusetts. John S., who was born October 6, 1908, was graduated in the Dallas Center High School and at the time of this writing, in 1931, is a member of the senior class at Iowa State College, at Ames, where he is pursuing the prescribed courses in agriculture and animal husbandry.

Mr. Rhinehart has continued as one of the most enterprising representatives of progressive farm industry in his native county, where he is the owner of valuable land interests. This land now forms a substantial part of Rhinehart Farms, Incorporated, which has as its stockholders and directors Charles Rhinehart, Frances B. Rhinehart, Helen L. Rhinehart and John S. Rhinehart. The operation of the eleven farm units of the incorporation, which is located mostly in Dallas County, specializes in raising grain and

feeding cattle and hogs.

Mr. Rhinehart has been a stalwart supporter of the principles of the Republican party. He served as representative from his district in the Fortieth, Fortieth Extra and Forty-first General Assemblies of Iowa. He takes a loyal interest in all that concerns the welfare and advancement of his community. He has served as a director of the school district of Dallas Center for the past eighteen years, and has acted in the capacity of president for the past seven years. His Masonic affiliations include his membership in Delta Lodge No. 356, Dallas Center, Temple Commandery No. 4, Des Moines, and Za Ga Zig Temple of the Mystic Shrine, Des Moines. He is affiliated also with both Subordinate and Encampment organizations of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows.

JUNIUS G. LUCAS, editor and publisher of the Madrid Register-News, is a member of an old-

time newspaper family of Iowa.

He was born in Boone County, this state, January 18, 1879, son of Corydon L. and Nancy (Sturdevant) Lucas. His father was born in Indiana, in 1839, came out to Boone County, Iowa, in 1853 and was a farmer and school teacher near Boone and for two years operated a newspaper at Boonsborough. From there he moved to Madrid, where he engaged in the real estate and insurance business, and for two terms held the office of postmaster under President Cleveland. No one in Boone County has a better knowledge of people and events and all the things that enter into local history. He wrote the history of Boone County published in 1914 and he was the founder of the Madrid Historical Society. Largely due to his interest a remarkable collection of historical items and relics has been gathered and this collection was recently placed permanently in the Madrid High School Building. He was also honored with the office of first mayor of Madrid. He is now ninety years of age and is known as the grand old man of his community. He is a member of the Christian Church and has always been a Democrat. He and Nancy Sturdevant were married in Boone County. She was born in Indiana and came out to Iowa with her parents in 1851. Her father, John Sturdevant, was a farmer near Madrid and died there in 1866. Her mother, Mary Greene Sturdevant, was born in North Carolina and died in 1889. The children of Corydon L. Lucas are: J. W. deceased; H. V., a hardware merchant at Madrid; and Junius G.

Junius G. Lucas attended the grade and high schools of Madrid, had a business course and learned the trade of printer in the plant of the newspaper conducted by his brother J. W. at Madrid. When his brother sold out he bought another paper in Platte City, Missouri, and Junius worked there for two years. He was also for a time with the Leavenworth Times in Kansas, and the Kansas City Star.

Poor health caused him to give up work as a printer and, returning to Madrid, he spent a year as a farmer. In 1904 he bought the Register News, and for a quarter of a century has continued this very lively local newspaper as its editor and manager. An auxiliary of the newspaper is the Western Printing Company, which specializes in the printing and manufacture of bank supplies and does an extensive business over Iowa and the two adjoining states.

Mr. Lucas is also a director in the Farmers Savings Bank at Madrid and is a director of the Red Ball Company, a proprietary medicine manufacturing concern, with plants at Madrid and another at Memphis, Tennessee. This company employs 800 salesmen, and covers twenty-six

states.

Mr. Lucas is a member of the Masonic fraternity and the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, belongs to the Grant Club at Des Moines and is a member of the Christian Church. He married at Madrid, Iowa, in 1904 Miss Maude Halsey who was born in Boone County, daughter of C. W. Halsey, a lumberman. She finished her education in the Madrid High School. Mr. and Mrs. Lucas are the parents of four children: Max L., born in 1906, was educated in the Madrid High School and is a graduate of the School of Journalism of Iowa State College at Ames and now associated with his father in the Register-News; Cathryn, born in 1909, is a graduate of the Madrid High School and is a junior in Drake University of Des Moines; Lillian, born in 1911, also a student in Drake University; and Robert, born in 1913, is attending high school at Madrid.

ROBERT R. HIBBS, who is a director and the manager of the Gode's Department Store at Marengo, judicial center of Iowa County, has also the distinction of being a past grand chancellor of the Iowa Grand Lodge of the Knights of Pythias, having served in 1926 and 1927.

Mr. Hibbs was born at Fontanelle, Adair County, Iowa, June 9, 1884, and is a son of William C. and Sarah (Durr) Hibbs, the former of whom was born in Ohio and the latter of whom was a representative of one of the honored pioneer families of Iowa County, Iowa, near Millersburg.




