The body was taken to Kansas City for burial.



University of Minnesota. In preparation for his chosen profession he completed a course in the medical department of the University of Illinois, in which he was graduated as a member of the class of 1920. After thus receiving his degree of Doctor of Medicine he served two years as an interne in the University Hospital, and he then established his residence at Perry, Iowa, where he has continued in active general practice since 1921 and where he now has a substantial and representative professional business.

In 1916 Doctor Elvidge was in service as a sergeant in the Medical Corps of a command of Minnesota Field Artillery, a division of the Minnesota National Guard that was equipping for service on the Mexican border. In the World war period he entered hospital service at the Great Lakes Naval Training Station, near Chicago, where he was stationed from 1918 until relieved from active duty, January 1, 1919, though it was not until September 30, 1921, that he received his honorable discharge from the hospital service of the United States navy.

Doctor Elvidge has membership in the Dallas County Medical Society, Iowa State Medical Society and American Medical Association, his political allegiance is given to the Republican party, his Masonic affiliations include his membership in the Mystic Shrine, and he is affiliated likewise with the American Legion and the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks. In his home city he is a member of the Rotary Club, and here he and his wife have membership in the Congregational Church.

September 19, 1924, marked the marriage of Doctor Elvidge to Miss Lenore Human, who was born and reared at Algona, Kossuth County, a daughter of Hugh Human. Mrs. Elvidge was graduated in the high school at Algona and thereafter was a student of music at Drake University, Des Moines. Doctor and Mrs. Elvidge are popular factors in the social life of their home city.

GEORGE W. POTTS, JUNIOR. Coming of the sturdy Scotch-Irish stock that has furnished this country with some of its most honorable and upright men and women, George W. Potts, Junior, is proud of the fact that he inherits many of their characteristics, and that he comes of a people who know no surrender to evil of any kind. In his practice of the law at Fort Madison, Iowa, he lives up to the fine ideals of his profession and his ancestors, and stands deserv-

edly high in popular esteem.


George W. Potts, Junior, was born at Kansas City, Missouri, April 15, 1890, a son of George W. Potts, Senior, the latter a native of Jackson County, Missouri, where he attended the common schools. For years he was engaged in the grocery and general store business, and also did considerable contracting. He married Miss Katherine Wahhn, of Jackson County, Missouri, who died in 1893, but he survives and still resides at Kansas City. They had four children: George W. Potts, Junior; Walter E., of Des Moines, Iowa; Mrs. Anna Geiting, of Kansas City; and Charles, the latter having died in infancy.

After attending the public schools of Kansas City through the high-school course, from which he was graduated in 1905, George W. Potts, Junior, began earning his own living, although he had been a paper boy while in school. He also found time to play baseball and football, and was president of the American Boys' Club at school. After working for local concerns he entered the employ of the Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe Railroad, in 1905, and continued with it until 1919. During that period he studied law it until 1919. During that period he studied law in the office of E. C. Weber, one of the promi-nent attorneys of Fort Madison, and he also took a special course from Professor Rush of the Kansas School of Law. In October, 1919, his years of intensive study, combined with his daily work, were rewarded by his admission to the bar, and he entered at once upon the practice of his profession at Fort Madison. For several years he served as chairman of the board of police and fire commissioners of his city; and in 1923 a further honor was conferred upon him in his election to the Lower House of the Iowa General Assembly, and he served very capably for one term. In 1927 Mr. Potts took Roy Geizleman into partnership with him, the present firm being Potts & Geizleman, with offices in the Odd Fellows Building. He is a member of the Lee County Bar Association, the Iowa State Bar Association and the American Bar Association. His fraternal associations are those which he maintains with the Ancient Free and Accepted Masons and the Independent Order of Odd Fellows. Since he cast his first vote he has been a strong supporter of the Democratic party, and one of its local leaders. Long a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church, he is one of its stewards at Fort Madison, and an earnest worker for its support.

Mr. Potts married in 1910 Miss Eletta Marie Skinner, of Missouri, and they have one child, Ruth Louise, who was born in 1912. As a lawyer Mr. Potts ranks high among his professional associates, and he is equally valuable as a citizen. As is but natural in a man of Mr. Potts' experience, he is deeply interested in legislative matters, and believes that the time is not so far distant when those elected to the assemblies will take more conscientiously the duties of their office, and will seek to provide for the people of the entire state rather than to wrangle over legislation for favored centers. Until this is done he feels the best results cannot be attained, nor will the state itself occupy the place to which it is entitled in the Union. The same ideas which relate to the state assemblies are applicable to local affairs, and he is constantly urging the importance of concerted action to secure different improvements. Such men as Mr. Potts are a real asset to their communities, and their associates are liable to look to them for advice and

leadership.


