Irving Beeman Died Wednesday

Irving E. Beeman, member of a prominent pioneer family, passed away Wednesday afternoon following an illness. He was well-known throughout this area where he had been a business man for many years, served as representative in the legislature, mayor of Waukon, and chairman of the oil rationing board during World War II. He was a member of the Masonic lodge, Presbyterian church, Kiwanis club and other organizations, retained a keen interest in civic affairs and was active until the final weeks of his life.

One brother, Fred Beeman of Waukon, survives him. A niece, Mrs. Cora Kopke of Waukon, also remains. Other nieces and a nephew are Mrs. William Dalrymple of Bethesda, Md., Mrs. A. L. Wisner of Athens, Mich.; Mrs. Harold Sage of Dover, Del.; and Leon Beeman of Moline, Ill.

Born Nov. 13, 1867 in Jefferson township, Mr. Beeman was a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. C. D. Beeman. He was graduated from Waukon high school and attended a business college, entering his father's mercantile business as a career which he followed until his retirement 15 years ago.

He was married Oct. 10, 1893 to Anna B. Hall, who passed away in 1931.

The funeral will be held at 2 o'clock Sunday afternoon from Martin's funeral home with burial in Oakland cemetery. The Rev. Mr. A. H. Grossheim will officiate. Pallbearers will be Harold Bender, M. H. Goede, Boyd Smith, Fred Hausman, Dr. Warren Hayes and C. H. Megorden.
