City Engineer Benton Anderson added a plea to the council to consider a long-range plan for conditioning of the street since it is one of the main north-south arteries in the city.

Theodore Malmsbury, a Van
Nuys mining engineer who died
in a prison camp in the Philip-
pines, will be reburied in Glen-

at 2 p.m. Mr. Malmsbury was a
civilian mine superintendent
when the Japanese invaded Lu-
zon. He was captured, according
to his sister, Miss Gladys Malms-
bury, as he sought to join Ameri-
can armed forces. Army records
indicate he died May 14, 1942, at
the age of 37. Cause of death is
undetermined. In addition to his
sister he leaves his mother, Mrs.
Mamie Malmsbury. Both live at
