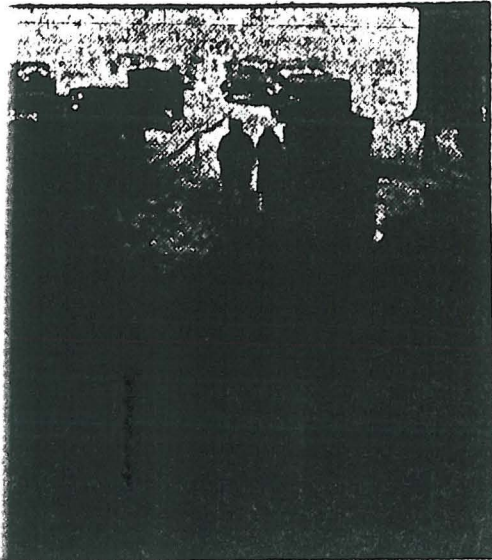
- He was born on a farm near Sarsfield in Potosi, Mo. He moved to Jasper County in 1881.

Former Legislator Dies in Oskaloosa.

 OSKALOOSA, IA.—David Meredith, 67, of Whittier, Cal., died at Mercy hospital here early Thursday of injuries suffered in a 40-foot fall from a windmill at his farm near Lynnville, Tuesday.

The body was taken to Lynnville for burial.

Mr. Meredith formerly represented Jasper county, both in the senate and house of representatives.

Surviving are his wife; two sons, Robert of Whittier, Clifford of Ames, and one daughter, Mrs. May Gray of Stubenville, Ohio. Mr. Meredith and his wife had been called here by serious illness of their son, Clifford, a patient in the hospital.

Mr. Meppelink lived in the Leighton, Pella, Sully and Lynnville areas. He was a painter by trade.

David Meredith

David Meredith, youngest son of Thomas Jefferson Meredith (b. April, 13, 1867), married Hattie Emma Hunt (b. November 25, 1868) of Whittier, California on August 20, 1890. David died April 18, 1935, and his wife died October 6, 1949. They were the parents of five children: Ozro J. (b. May 20, 1891 — d. March 29, 1930) married M. Frances Hollingsworth; Clifford Hunt (b. March 29, 1895 — d. August 21, 1951) married Nellie Eloise Smith, and later married Ruby Moorman; Lowell B. (b. June 2, 1899 — d. April 10, 1918); Robert D. (b. January 27, 1905) married M. Viola (Ola) Halloway; and Susanna Mae (b. September 24, 1906) married William Gray.

David's parents came to this vicinity in 1857, and settled on the farm southeast of Lynnville, presently the home of William and Mae Gray. They moved to Lynnville when David was 12 years old.

In the winter of 1888, David accompanied his parents to Whittier for a visit with relatives. It was here that David met his wife, who was keeping house for her grandparents, Jonathan and Rebecca Bailey. Jonathan Bailey lived in a ranch house, the only house on the 1200 acre barley field, that was later to become the town of Whittier.

The house has recently been restored and turned over to the town of Whittier. In 1890, David and Hattie were married at this ranch house and they returned to Lynnville, where he engaged in farming.

In 1915, David built a new home in Lynnville on the site of the "old home" which was moved north. The "new home" is presently owned by John Smalldrige, and the "old house" was torn down in order to build the Retirement Home.

In 1915, electricity was installed in some of the homes in Lynnville, and Dave Meredith's home was one of the first to have it. The "juice" was turned off at 9:00 p.m. This was a very hospitable home, and at school or church parties, it added to the hilarity when there was a mad scramble to light candles and kerosene lamps when the lights went out.

For the "House Warming", venison from the

Meredith "Deer Herd" was served at a dinner for families and friends of those who worked on the new house. The first deer were purchased from the Lincoln Zoo in Chicago in 1913.

David entered politics in 1913. He served two terms in the Iowa House of Representatives, and one term in the Senate. He was responsible for the first child clinic grant to the University Hospital at Iowa City. The amount of the grant was \$25,000.

In 1923, David, Hattie, Robert, and Mae moved to Whittier, California.

Jesse Meredith

Jesse Meredith, son of James and Mary Stanley Meredith was born in N.C. He came with his mother and seven brothers and sisters, the oldest 12 yrs., to Indiana in 1829 and came to Lynnville, Iowa in 1858. He married Luzena Macy, daughter of William and Phoebe Hiatt Macy. They (the Macy's) came to Lynnville from Henry Co. Ind. in 1856. They were the parents of 12 children.

On October 2, 1940, he was married to Winema Sparks, daughter of Milton and Ella Rolls Sparks. During World War II he spent three years in the navy.

After returning from the service, he operated a Tractor Repair and Plumbing and Heating shop for twenty-four years. He gave it up due to poor health. He passed away January 26, 1973. Winema is still living in Lynnville.
