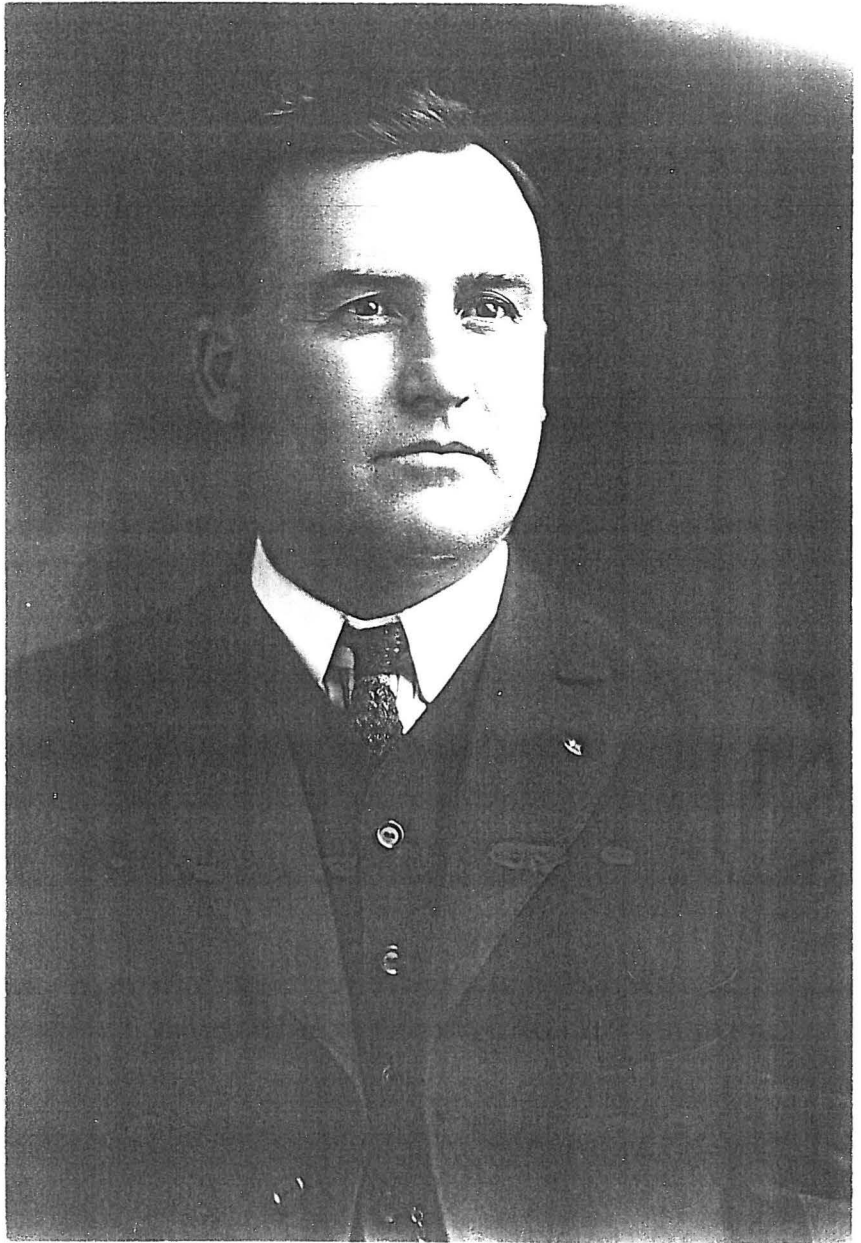

M. B. Pitt Dies; Ex-Speaker of Iowa House

Funeral services were held at the Bolton-Cranston Funeral home here Monday afternoon for M. B. Pitt, 74, former speaker of the Iowa House of Representatives, who passed away here Saturday, Jan. 20.

Francis Harper was the clergyman in charge. Hymns were sung by Mrs. Lloyd Donn and E. A. Rosenberger, accompanied by Lucille Pitt. Bearers were Frank Pitt, Jesse Pitt, Glenn Pitt, Wayne Pitt, Milton Pitt and Carroll Campbell, with interment at Crescent.

Milton Bird Pitt, son of Sidney and Patience Pitt was born near Macedonia, June 2, 1876. His parents moved to Yorkshire when he was 7 years old and later to the old home in Cass Township, in 1884 where he grew to manhood, and after his marriage to Caroline Jane Gilson on December 25, 1896 later moving to the farm adjoining his parents. He attended the rural school, later the Woodbine High school and became a successful teacher for several years in connection with his farming interests. In 1908 Bird, as he was familiarly known, was elected to the office of County Treasurer and served three terms. Following his term of County Treasurer he was chosen to represent the people of Harrison County in 1914. He served two terms in the capacity and was honored by the house membership to become Speaker of the 37th General Assembly.

In 1918 he was elected to represent the 7th State Senatorial District, serving one term, then moving to Pottawattamie County and retired from public office.

In early manhood he became a member of the Reorganized church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints.

They became the parents of eleven children and on December 25, 1946 they celebrated their golden wedding and was blessed in that all eleven children were living.

Surviving are his wife and nine children, Mrs. David Williams, Milton L. and Willis C., all of Logan; Frank L. and Jesse E., of Missouri Valley, Glen of Crescent, Mrs. Carroll Campbell of Rockford, Ill., Wayne of Griswold, and Perry of Van Nuys, California. Louis and Sidney preceded their father in death in the summer of 1947. Also surviving are nineteen grandchildren and three great grandchildren, two brothers, David W. of Neola, Jesse A. of Persia, and one sister, Mrs. Patience Walker of Woodbine and numerous nieces and nephews and a host of friends mourn his loss.

New Record on Farm Planning Is Established

A new all-time record on farm planning was hung on the year just closed by 11 farmers and field technicians the U. S. Soil Conservation Service. At Ames today, Mendell State Conservation announced 4,898 farm plans were developed during this is an increase over the preceding year and an average of 16 for each working day throughout the year.

In addition to plans, over 100 old cooperators were contacted, assisted in revising and improving the program on their farms was double the follow-up made last year.

Mendell attributed the gain in farm planning to increased public interest in conservation and to state aid to the appropriation made at the 53rd general assembly. To state soil conservation had no source of funds for administrative or technical services.

However, the 53rd session recognized the need for state of districts and made the appropriation. A total of \$26,865.44 was allocated to the districts on a need basis for fiscal year 1949-50. An additional \$26,865.44 was allocated to the commissioner's expenses supplies and demonstration materials. Commissioners in the district without salary. The year just closed was the first year of state assistance.

"I believe the state deserves commendation for forward step in furnishing financial assistance to its districts," Mendell said. "The district planning bodies used these funds where in their own judgment money would do the most good in most cases it was invested in clerical and clerical assistance badly needed office equipment. To the U. S. Soil Conservation Service, this meant that districts, state aid could look after all clerical duties freeing our technicians they might spend 100 per cent of their working hours out on farms. Certainly a 28 per cent increase in farm planning would indicate the state's investment is paying off."

The local soil conservation district was no exception to the wide trend. L. P. Culver, man of the District Board, said today. During 1950, plans were developed by members of this district with technical assistance of the SCS. Memorial to the Honorable Milton Bird Pitt of Harrison County

MR. SPEAKER: Your committee, appointed to prepare a suitable resolution commemorating the life, character and public service of the late Honorable Milton Bird Pitt, begs leave to submit the following memorial:

The Honorable Milton Bird Pitt was born June 2, 1875, on a farm near Macedonia, Pottawattamie County, Iowa, and died January 20, 1951, at Logan, Iowa. His father, Sidney Pitt, was born in Indiana and was a member of the 17th Kentucky Cavalry in the War of the Rebellion; his mother, Patience E. Pitt, was a native of Pottawattamie County, Iowa. At the age of seven, he moved with his parents to Yorkshire, and later to a home in Cass Township, Harrison County. He attended the rural schools and Woodbine Normal School, and taught several years. His life work was farming.

Mr. Pitt served as township clerk two terms, and three terms as county treasurer of Harrison County, Iowa. He was a member of the House of Representatives in the Thirty-sixth and Thirty-seventh General Assemblies, serving as Speaker of the House in the Thirty-seventh General Assembly. He was elected State Senator in 1918 and served in the Thirty-eighth and Thirty-ninth sessions. Moving from Harrison to Pottawattamie County in 1919, he expected to retire from active public life.

Mr. Pitt, recognized over the state and nation as a public speaker, was an earnest advocate of rugged individualism and initiative, farsighted in the socialistic trends of public thinking and government. Beginning immediately after World War I, he was called upon to devote much time to public appearances, pleading for the preservation of constitutional government, zealously admonishing his audiences from state to state never to yield expedience for principles in governmental or personal matters.

Mr. Pitt was married to Caroline Jane Gilson, December 25, 1896. They were the parents of eleven children, all of whom were living when their parents celebrated their golden wedding anniversary December 25, 1946. Two sons, Louie and Sidney, preceded their father in death in the summer of 1947. Surviving are his widow; seven sons, Milton and Willis of Logan, Frank and Jesse of Missouri Valley, Glen of Crescent, Wayne of Griswold, and Perry of Van Nuys, California; and two daughters, Mrs. David Williams of Logan and Mrs. Carroll Campbell of Rockford, Illinois.

Mr. Pitt was a member of the Reorganized Church of Latter Day Saints.

Therefore, Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Fifty-fourth General Assembly of Iowa: That in the passing of the Honorable Milton Bird Pitt, the people, not only of Harrison and Pottawattamie Counties, but of the entire state of Iowa, have sustained a great loss.

Be It Further Resolved: That a copy of this resolution be spread upon the Journal of the House and that the Chief Clerk be directed to forward an enrolled copy to the family of the deceased.

Memorial to the Honorable Wilson Reed of Jefferson County

MR. SPEAKER: Your committee, appointed to prepare a suitable resolution commemorating the life, character and public service of the late Honorable Wilson Reed, begs leave to submit the following memorial:

Wilson Reed was born October 13, 1873, at Fairfield, Iowa, son of the late Carson and Mary W. Reed. He died very suddenly of a heart attack June 29, 1950. He attended public school, Parsons Academy, graduated from Parsons College in Fairfield in 1895, receiving an A.B. degree.

In 1900 he was united in marriage to Flora Bradley. They were the parents of two sons, Joseph Bradley and Allen Wilson.

He was a veteran of the Spanish American War and of World War I, spending ten months in service in France.

For many years he was a tax consultant, first in the Federal Bureau of Internal Revenue and then in private practice. He was active at the time of his death in this profession.

Mr. Reed served as Representative from Jefferson County in the Forty-ninth, Fiftieth, Fiftieth Extra, Fifty-first, Fifty-second and the Fifty-second Extra sessions. He served with honor and distinction during these sessions.

He was a member of the Presbyterian Church, Masonic Lodge, Odd Fellows Lodge, Elks Lodge, American Legion and United Spanish War Veterans.

Therefore, Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Fifty-fourth General Assembly of Iowa: That in the passing of the Honorable Wilson Reed, the state has lost a valued and honored citizen and the family a loving husband and father and the House would tender, by this resolution, its sincere sympathy to his beloved family in this great sorrow.

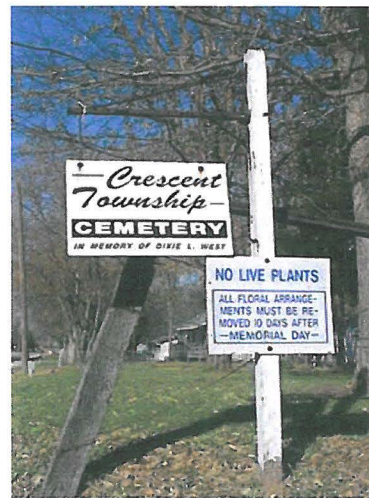

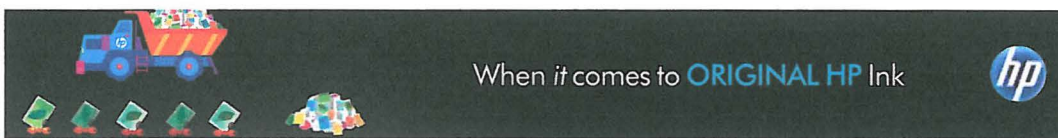

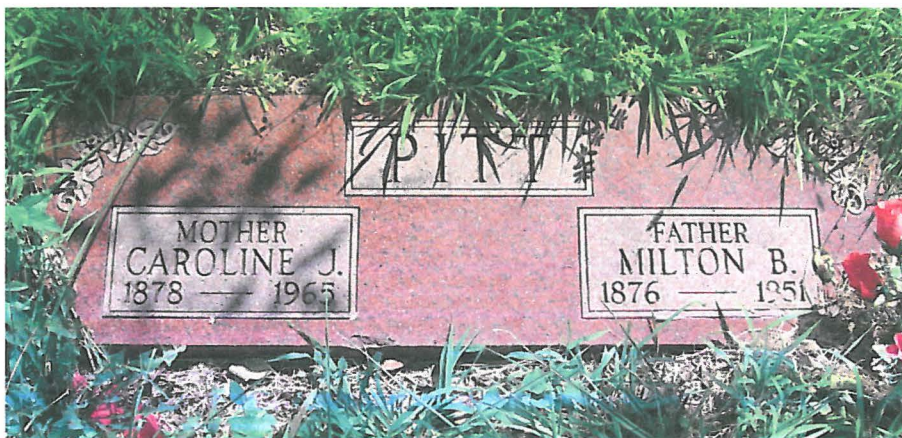
