HENRY ENOS SIMPKINS

Henry Enos Simpkins, son of Thos. and Phoebe Simpkins, was born near Stockport Feb. 23, 1852, and passed away Oct. 30, 1926, aged 74 years, 8 months and 7 days.

He was married August 1, 1872, to Mary E. Watson, she having preceded him in death Nov. 21, 1913. To this union were born seven children, four having preceded him in death. He leaves to mourn his passing three children: Frank, Clarence and Allen; two sisters, Mrs. Calvin Farlan and Mrs. John Bales of Stockport; eight grandchildren; and one grandchild. He has lived in and near Stockport all of his life except five years spent in Missouri.

The funeral service was held on Monday, Nov. 1st, at 2 o'clock at the Baptist church in Hillsboro, with interment in the Hillsboro cemetery.

Obituary of Jerry M. Morrow

Jeremiah M. Morrow, eldest son of Albert and Sarah Ann Morrow, was born on a farm near Douds, Van Buren county, Iowa, Feb. 21, 1854. He departed this life at his home in Douds, Iowa, Nov. 17, 1926, aged 72 years, 8 months and 26 days. His parents were natives of Belmont county, Ohio, and early pioneers of Iowa. His early education was in common rural schools and later, in Keosauqua high school and Birmingham Academy. He taught school and worked in a store for several years. In 1882 he engaged in general mercantile business at Douds, Iowa, and continued the same until 1917.

In 1918 he was elected representative from Van Buren county, and was a member of the 38th General Assembly. He voted for the ratification of both the Woman suffrage and the Prohibition laws, and helped pass the first good roads law. After completing his term as representative, he was appointed State Food Inspector in Dairy and Food Department, and served four years until June first, 1923, when he retired.

In religion he was a member of the M. E. church, in which he was a faithful member and in politics he was a republican. Among the fraternal organizations of which he was a member was the Masonic order, having attained to the rank of Knights Templar, and the Mystic Shrine; also the I. O. O. F. and the Knights of Pythias.

He was married to Alice E. Chalfant, daughter of Milton Chalfant, Oct. 2, 1878. Two daughters and three sons were born to them. Nellie, the oldest, daughter resides in Walla Walla, Wash. Bessie, the second daughter, died in 1915. The three sons all live in Des Moines, Iowa. Roscoe, the eldest, has been employed more than 20 years in the Peoples Savings Bank, and Jay in the life insurance business; Harry is a dentist, a graduate from the State University of Iowa. The two younger sons participated in the World War; Jay was a Sergeant in an Aero Squadron. Harry was a yeoman in the Navy.

He leaves to mourn their loss his faithful wife, one daughter, three sons, two grandchildren.

The funeral services took place from his late home on Thursday, Nov. 18, 1926, Rev. G. W. Barber of Eldon conducting the service.

PROMINENT DOUDS, CITIZEN IS DEAD

J. M. Morrow, former state representative from Van Buren county and prominent citizen of Douds, died at his home Wednesday morning at 8:00 o'clock. Mr. Morrow had been ill for some time with an affliction of the heart, and the end came peacefully while the patient was asleep.

Mr. Morrow had long been recognized as a leader in the political life of the county as a member of the republican party. He served in the thirty-eighth general assembly and later under the commission of public health. He was an active member of the M. E. church, a member of the Shrine, Knights Templar, Royal Arch Masons and the Celestial Lodge No. 413, A. F. & A. M.

He is survived by his wife and three sons: Roscoe C., Dr. Harry C. and Jay of Des Moines, and by one daughter, Mrs. Nellie Morrow Bergman of Walla Walla, Wash. Arrangements for funeral services have not been announced.

JEFFERSON COUNTY ROAD JOB LET

The Des Moines Asphalt Paving Co., of Des Moines, was low bidder at Fairfield Wednesday when bids were opened for the paving of federal highway No. 34, west from Fairfield to the Wapello county line. The paving will be 10.93 miles in length, eighteen feet wide, and the total cost, under the Des Moines company's bid, will be \$275,000. The bid figures \$2.21 a square yard for concrete and 42 cents a cubic yard for excavation, of which there are approximately 35,000 yards. The Des Moines Asphalt Paving Co. was successful bidder last year for the paving of No. 34 east from Fairfield to the Henry county line.

Mrs. McCall leaves to mourn her departure her loving daughter, Mrs. Hill, two grandchildren, Ralph and Hazel, one sister and a number of nephews and nieces and a host of friends.

FRED STANEK OF IOWA WINS WORLD

Fremont, Neb., Nov. 14—husking championship has been claimed in the fall corn state Stank of Fort Dodge, Iowa, also held the title in 1924.

Stanek, the 27 year old, proved his supremacy here by gathering more corn in 80 minutes. His gross corn was 30 bushels and his deductions were 2.77 for gleanings and none for this was said to be an unusual record.
