

The deceased had entered the hospital a few days ago for treat-

William G. vander Ploeg was one of a family of ten children, was born in Marion county, December 27, 1881, a son of Ruard vander Ploeg and Pietie Terpstra vander Ploeg. He was educated in the public schools and attended Central college at Pella and later attended the state university of Iowa, graduating from the law school in 1903.

The deceased-was united in marriage with Miss Carrie Cox, of Pella, September 21; 1911, and the same year he entered daw practice at Pella, where he remained until he came to Knoxville in Januany, 1911, and opened a law office. For a short time he was a partner of C. H. Amos, of Knoxville, then a few years by himself and later entered a partnership with J. H. Johnson, in Knoxville, From 1923 to 1927 he was a judge of the district court in this district. After 1927 he entered the law firm of Norman R. Hays and C. C. Heer, where he remained a few years, until Mr. Hays was elected judge of the district court. At this time he continued as partner of C. C. Heer for a few years and then entered law practice by himself until his retirement a few years ago.

For the past twenty years James M. 
