Audubon women killed in rail crossing mishap

CARROLL. — Two Audubon school teachers were killed in the Carroll business district Saturday afternoon when the car in which they were riding was struck broadside by a freight train.

They were identified as Miss Zelwyn A Graham, 58, an English teacher at Audubon high school and Miss Ruth A Savin, 62, who was an elementary teacher. Both were pronounced dead at a Carroll hospital.

Sheriff Al Thorup said the car was struck by a Chicago and North western freight at a downtown crossing protected by flashing signal and cross bars.

A unidentified witness told authorities he saw the women's car pull onto the tracks just as the signal started flashing.

The women apparently became confused, said Thorup, and drove straight ahead. The train hit the car broadside, carried it into a tangle of metal.

The women were hurled from their car by the force of the impact.

The train engineer was identified as Basil Joice of Boone.

Sheriff Thorup said the two deaths boosted Carroll county's traffic fatality count to 15 for the year. Nine of the deaths have occurred within the past month.

Surviving Miss Graham are her brother, Mel, Audubon county attorney, and sister, Mrs Milton Krasne of Omaha. Miss Savin leaves no immediate survivors.

Doug Rogers, dean of attorneys, died



Douglas Rogers, 93, dean of Carroll county attorneys, died at his home early Tuesday morning after being in failing health for a short time. Prominent for many years in civic and democratic party circles, Mr Rogers was widely known throughout the state for his varied endeavors.

Funeral services will be held at Ohde Funeral Home Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock with the Rev Lester Moore of the Methodist church in charge. Dr Charles Hummer will be vocalist and Mrs Bonita Hagedorn organist. Burial will be in the Manning cemetery.

Mr Rogers was born April 3, 1867 near Harlan, the son of Nelson A and Sarah Johnson-Rogers. He attended rural schools near Harlan and later graduated from Harlan High school. After attending normal school at Shenandoah, he enrolled in the State University of Iowa law school, graduating with the class of 1891.

He came to Manning that year and the following year was married to Mary E Flannery. They were the parents of two daughters. Mrs Rogers died in 1933 and several years later he was married to Helen Flannery, who survives.

Besides his practice of law, which he conducted until only recently, Mr Rogers served as mayor of Manning for six and one-half years, spent four years on the board of education—three of them as president; he served three sessions in the Iowa state legislature from 1915 to 1921, and was named delegate to two national democratic conventions, to Houston in 1928 and to Philadelphia in 1936.

Besides his first wife, he was preceded in death by his parents, three sisters and five brothers.

Survivors include his wife, Helen, and two daughters, Mrs Ray L (Eulalia) Jaeger of Tulsa, Okla, and Mrs Walter W (Ruth) Turner of Fort Wayne, Ind. There are also three grandchildren and 12 great grandchildren.

County TB meet Tuesday

Town and township tuberculosis Christmas seal sale chairmen in Carroll county met at the Presbyterian church here Tuesday for a noon luncheon and workshop. Mrs H W Hagedorn, county seal sale chairman, was in charge. Present for the meeting was Mrs Esther Arthmann, field worker of the Iowa Tuberculosis and Health Ass'n.

Mrs Hagedorn announced that the county's goal in the seal sales this year was \$3,291.32. Seals must be in the mail by Nov 14. Last year, 49% of those contacted returned money for the seals; 48% did not reply, and 3% returned the seals only. However, only 21% of the county's population was reached in the campaign.

Mrs Arthmann announced that 376 new cases of tuberculosis were found in the state from Jan 1 until Oct 8, 1960, with two cases in Carroll county. There were 28 relapsed cases.

Following lunch served by ladies of the United Presbyterian Women, the business meeting was conducted by Mrs Leo Bruck of Manning, county vice chairman. Mrs John Edgerton of Manning is secretary. Mrs Bruck read the financial record, and Mrs Edgerton gave a report on the TB mobile unit which was in the county the week of May 17. A total of 5,185 residents were x-rayed, and 4,911 healthy chests were found.

Mrs Arthmann, who has resigned her position and is moving to Alabama, thanked the group for its co-operation.
