Claus Anderson Services Today

Former Member State Legislature

STANTON—Funeral services were held today at Mamrelund Lutheran church here for Claus Ludwig Anderson, 90, retired farmer and a former state representative. He died Friday, June 23, at Cottage Rest home in Red Oak after an illness of two months.

E. Edwin Danielsen, seminary student and intern pastor here, officiated at the services. Burial was in Mamrelund cemetery here.

The son of Carl and Sarah Anderson, he was born March 12, 1871, in Frankfort township and was a child of the Halland settlement, southwest Iowa Swedish colony. He was the author of the book "Gracious Bounty," which tells of the founding and development of this colony.

He was married Dec. 20, 1905, at Stanton to Lottie Blade, another of the Halland settlement children. They farmed until March of 1937, when he retired and they moved to Stanton. Mrs. Anderson died in 1953.

Mr. Anderson was believed to be the oldest continuous member of Mamrelund Lutheran church here. He was a state representative from 1913-15 and was a director of the Lutheran Children's home near Stanton for 25 years. He was a charter member of the Montgomery County Farm Bureau and had served as president of the old Stanton State bank, the Farmers Mercantile Co. of Red Oak and the Stanton Milling Co.

He was active in the Mamrelund Historical society and was said the man most responsible for establishment of the Stanton community library.

He has been transferred to Des Moines by Ipalco as central division superintendent. The transfer is a promotion.

Cackler said a special meeting of the C of C board of directors has been called for Tuesday noon, June 27, at which time it is expected a successor as Chamber president will be named.

Announcement of Cackler's successor as Ipalco's Red Oak district manager is expected in the near future, it was stated.

Cackler has been the Red Oak division manager since Sept. 1, 1958, coming here from Des Moines, where he had been Ipalco's superintendent of electric distribution. A graduate of Iowa State college in 1950 with a bachelor of science degree in electrical engineering, he has been with Ipalco since 1950.

The Cacklers have three children, Tom, 15; Bob, 13, and Susan, 9.
