Two Widely Known Men Died Sunday

zations of which he was a member. He enjoyed good health until his last illness resulting in death Sunday, June 13, 1937, aged 76 years, 10 months and 14 days.

Funeral services were held Wednesday afternoon from the home, with Rev. T. B. Collins officiating. Members of Twilight Chapter No. 329 A. F. and A. M. had charge of the services at Lakeview cemetery, where the body was laid to rest.

Fred W. Jones

In the year 1868 on January 10, at Mitchell, Iowa, Fred W. Jones was born to Olive Jane and Walter B. Jones. He received his early education at Mitchell where he lived until 1882 when his parents and family moved to Milford township in Dickinson county. He operated his father's farm in that township until he was married in 1893 to Cora Miller of Bentley Creek, Penna., after which he purchased land near Milford, where he farmed until 1899. During that time he served as township assessor for six years.

In 1899 he was elected sheriff of Dickinson county, and in 1906 he moved to Spirit Lake to take office. He proved so capable in that capacity that he was re-elected five times and served a total of 13 years.

In 1912 he was honored by election to the house of representatives of the Iowa Legislature and was re-elected to that office in 1914 serving through the 33rd and 36th legislatures.

In the spring of 1913 he moved to Stony Point farm located on the north shore of Spirit Lake, where he continued farming until 1923 when he moved to Spirit Lake.

He was elected county supervisor and began serving in 1923 and continued in that same capacity for 12 years. In November 1936 he was again re-elected county supervisor but was never to fill his term of office. Many were his other and various activities too numerous to mention here. He was for many years a director in the First National bank of Spirit Lake. He became a Master Mason in 1891 and was affiliated with Twilight Lodge A. F. and A. M. He was also a Royal Arch Mason and a member of Twilight Chapter O. E. S.

He was stricken on November 1, 1936, and passed on to his eternal reward June 13, 1937, at 7:40 in the evening. He is survived by his wife and two children: Lewis W., of Spirit Lake, and Mrs. Glenn W. Rodger, of Maywood, Ill. Of his six brothers and sisters, two remain: Guy W. Jones, of Denver, Colo., and Mrs. Jarvis Dennis of Milford, Ia.

It is almost needless to add that he leaves also to mourn his absence a host of intimate friends for he was one of the most widely known and respected residents of Dickinson county. May his memory be revered and his work live on in the minds of men.

The last sad rites were held on Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock from the Presbyterian church, with Rev. Robert J. MacDaniel of the local church, and Rev. Herbert Marsh, a former pastor, officiating. Burial was made in the Okoboji cemetery. The Masons had charge of the services at the grave.
