F. Larrabee Final Rites At Clermont

Funeral services for Frederic Larrabee, 85, a well-known former Fort Dodge attorney and state senator, were held Saturday at his home in Clermont. Mr. Larrabee died Thursday at his home following a lengthy illness.

A native of Clermont, Mr. Larrabee was the son of William Larrabee who served as Iowa's governor from 1886 to 1890. He came to Fort Dodge as a young man and resided here for many years.

Frederic Larrabee was graduated from the Clermont High school and the State University of Iowa from where he received his law degree in 1898. He served as chairman of the Webster county Republican central committee at one time and was a state senator from the Webster-Calhoun district in the 33rd, 34th, 35th and 36th Iowa Legislatures from 1909 to 1917. He also was a delegate to the GOP national convention in Cleveland in 1924.

Frederic Larrabee

Funeral services for Frederic
Larrabee, 86, were held August
29 and burial made in the family
lot at the Clermont cemetery.

Mr. Larrabee was born at Cler-
mont, November 3, 1873, and died
August 27. He was the son of
Gov. William and Anna M. Ap-
pelman Larrabee, educated at
Clermont high school and Uni-
versity of Iowa.

He was a farm supervisor at
Fort Dodge in Webster county,
Brown Swiss dairy cattle breeder
and president of the state dairy
association, besides active in com-
munity and political circles.

His residence had been at Cler-
mont for the past few years.
