

County Wins Farm Bureau Quota Honor

The Taylor county Farm Bureau won the district banner at the Iowa Farm Bureau meeting in Des Moines last week, according to advice received this week by organization officials.

The banner was awarded to the Taylor county group for having the highest percentage of its membership quota paid by January 13 in the district which includes twelve southwest Iowa counties.

Eighty-nine per cent of the membership quota for Taylor county had been paid by that date, according to local group officials.

Fremont county had \$6 per cent and West Pottawattamie 82 per cent.

The Taylor county Farm Bureau will exceed its quota this year as will many other Bureaus. Eighty-two county groups in Iowa have already conducted 1940 membership campaigns and nearly every one has exceeded the 1939 membership.

Forty-two states are now federated with the American Farm Bureau Federation joining farmers of the east, west, north and south in a strong nationwide agricultural program.

Death of A. D. Nye.

A. D. Nye, 70, resident of Ringgold county for many years, passed away Sunday morning about 11 o'clock at his home south of Mount Ayr, death resulting from a heart attack. Mr. Nye had gone to the barn to look after live stock and it was there he suffered the attack.

The deceased was the father of Howard Nye and Mrs. Cleve Bunker of this place and was well known in this community, having been located at Benton for many years where he was station agent for the Chicago Great Western railroad. The many friends extend sympathy to the bereaved family.

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon at two o'clock from the Baptist church at Athelstan, the Rev. Geo. W. Warman, pastor, in charge. Burial was made at Athelstan.

The following life history was read

at the services:

Albert David Nye, son of William and Louisa Nye, was born March 1. 1869, at Chester, Iowa, and departed this life January 14, 1940, at his home south of Mount Avr. At the time of his death he was 70 years, 10 months

and 14 days of age.

He was united in marriage with Annetta Scott March 19, 1893, and to this union four children were born: Edgar who died in infancy, Thomas T. of Dunkerton, Howard H. of Diagonal, and Mrs. Grace Bunker of Diagonal. His wife, Annetta, passed away November 16, 1927. He was again united in marriage with Jessie Brown February 20, 1929, whom he leaves, together with an adopted son Jeane.

Besides his immediate family he leaves to mourn his death six grandchildren, two brothers and three sisters, and a host of other relatives and


friends.

Mr. Nye was a member of the Baptist church of Athelstan and later transferred his membership to the Baptist church at Bedford. At Bedford Mr. Nye served four years as treasurer of Taylor county. Later he served four years as state senator.
