Edmond Bradley, First State Births Mayor Of Eldon, Dies

ELDON. — Edmond J. Bradley, 86, first mayor of Eldon, died at 7:25 a. m. Sunday at the home of his nephew, James W. Reardon of Eldon, with whom he had lived since the death of his wife in December, 1945.

The son of James and Joanna Sechan Bradley, he was born in Ottumwa August 24, 1861. His wife was the former Leona May Allen, whom he married in 1897.

Besides serving as Eldon's mayor he had been postmaster, assessor and served as Wapello county representative in the Iowa legislature in 1913-15.

A nephew, George Schweer, who was reared in his home, died in 1941. There are no immediate relatives. James and Thomas Reardon of Eldon, Leo and Joseph Reardon of Eldon, John Schweer of Long Beach, Calif., Fred Schweer of Des Moines and Jim Schweer of Omaha are nephews and Mrs. Nora Scott of Hot Springs, Ark., is a niece.

The Rev. William Snell will conduct the funeral at 9 a. m. Tuesday at the St. Aloysius Catholic church in Eldon. Burial will be in Eldon. The body is at the Campbell-Rupp funeral home.

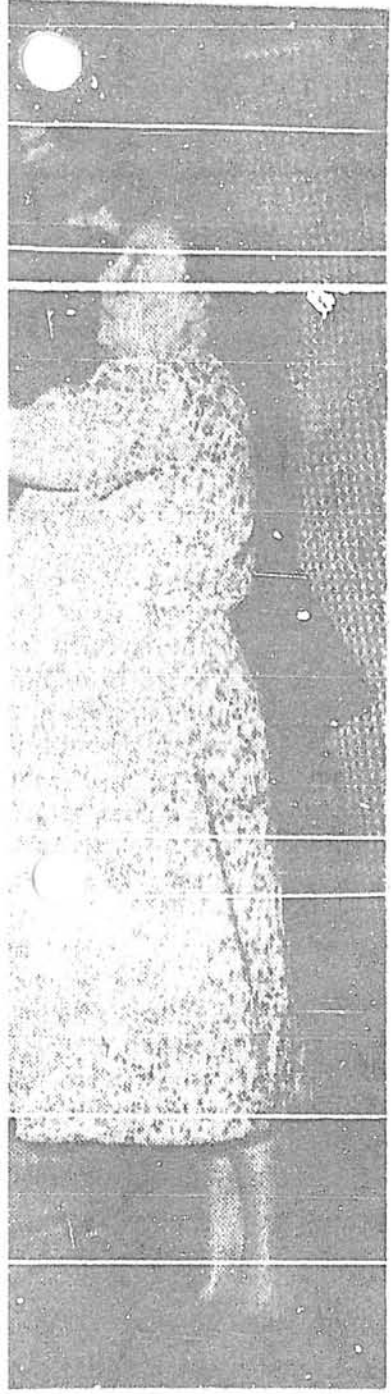
