

He tarmed for a time at Rockwell, lowa, between terms at the university and started practicing medicine at Britt,, la., where he suffered the hardships of the country doctor, sometimes having a territory of 60 miles around Britt, where he was the only doctor. He brought 3,000 babies into the world.

he was prominent in the development of the town of Britt, serving as its mayor, school board director, and representative to the lowa Legislature in the thirtytifth general assembly.

He and Mrs. Cole moved Clear Lake in October 1920 and lie set up a practice in the Cerro Gordo bank building and maintained it until his death.

tie has been a member of the Milwaukee railroad surgeons for over 50 years, a member of the Masonic todge for 65 years, having affiliated in 1874 in Davis, Ill. he was also a member of the I.O. O.F. lodge and Royal Arch Masons, an honorary life member of the Cerro Gordo Medical association, and affiliated with the Clear Lake Commercial club.

Surviving him are his wife, two daughters, Mrs. Ida Hendricks, and Mrs. W. A. Ames, of Clear Lake, and two granddaughters, Mrs. Gerald Brooks, Clear Lake, and Miss Charlotte Ames, Minnea-
