#### Hon. Isaac G. Scott Dead.

Hon. Isaac G. Scott of Walnut township, former representative from this county in the state house of representatives, had a relapse Saturday evening and his condition was considered critical. Relatives were called to the bedside. His brother, James, of Monmouth, Illinois, arrived Thursday and another brother, Joseph Scott of Ft. Morgan, Colorado, and his niece Mrs. Everett Graves of Ft. Morgan, Colorado, arrived Sunday. Uncle Ike, as he was affectionately called by his many friends throughout the county, passed away last evening at 8:26 o'clock, Wednesday, September 21, aged 71 years, 1 month and 11 days. Funeral services will be held from the home Saturday afternoon at two o'clock. The Masonic lodge will have charge of the services at the grave. Rev. M. M. Cable will preach the funeral and burial will be made in Farragut cemetery.

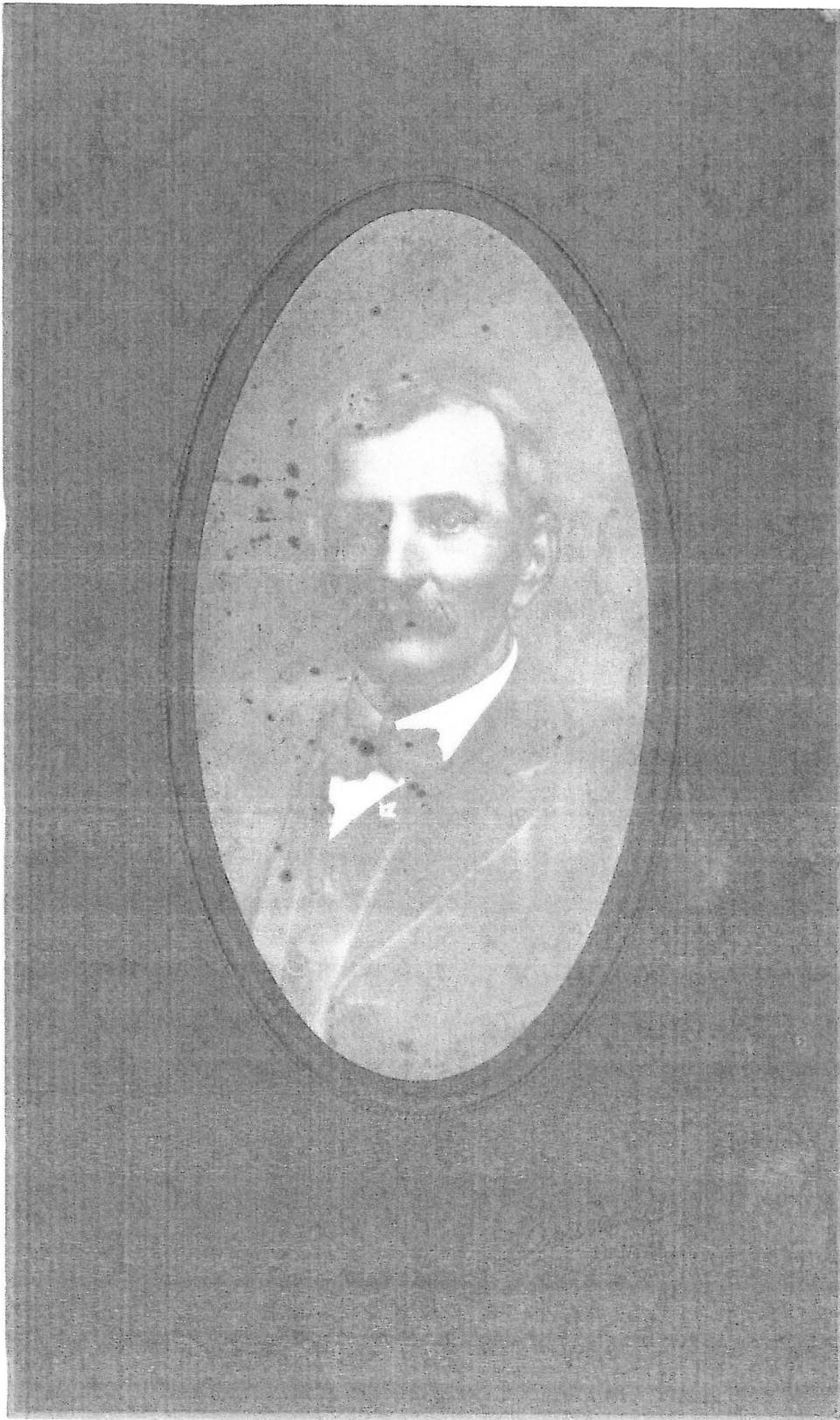

## ISAAC GIBSON AND SUSANNA (HIGH) SCOTT

Isaac Gibson Scott was born in Boone County, Indiana on August 9, 1850. When he was a small boy his parents, James Harvey and Jerusha Hickerson Scott, moved to Mercer County, Illinois where Isaac remained until after the death of his parents.

In 1876, Isaac came to Fremont County, Iowa where he worked as a farm laborer for several years. In 1879, he purchased land in Walnut Township from the railroad and on December 21, 1879 he married Susanna (Annie) High, daughter of Ephraim and Elizabeth High. (Ephraim and Elizabeth having come by covered wagon to Fremont County in 1856 from Licking County, Ohio.)

Isaac and Annie had four children: James Harvey (born March 6, 1881 - died July 3, 1947); Albert Leroy (born October 27, 1882 - died September 28, 1950); Grace Adeline (born June 15, 1890 - died January 24, 1983); Ruth Elizabeth (born April 7, 1892 - died August 26, 1993.)

Isaac and Annie lived on their "Oak Branch" farm until their deaths. Isaac was active in Walnut Township activities serving as Township Trustee and Assessor for several years. He also served as School Director and as Sunday School Superintendent at the Farmers City Methodist Church. In 1913 he was elected to represent Fremont County in the 35th General Assembly of the State Legislature. Isaac died September 21, 1921 and Annie died May 14, 1926.

James Harvey (Isaac's oldest son) married Cora Ross on March 28, 1906. Harvey and Cora purchased the Ephraim High farm in Walnut Township and lived there the remainder of their lives. They had three sons (Paul, Ward and Dale) all of whom became farmers in Fremont County.

Albert LeRoy (Bert) married Mable McIntyre on January 17, 1908. Bert and Mable, although having no children of their own, were very interested in their nieces and nephews. The highlight of the year being oyster stew on Christmas Eve at "Uncle Bert's and Aunt Mabel's". Bert and Mable farmed in Monroe Township until his death in 1950.

Upon graduating from Fairview School in Walnut Township, Grace attended Western Normal College in Shenandoah. She graduated in 1908 and then taught in the country schools of Fremont County for several years until she married Walter Truman Lorimor on May 1, 1912. Grace and Walter lived most of their lives on the Spring Valley Farm in Prairie Township where they raised eight children: Margaret, Scott, Frederick, Mary, Robert, Walter, Jr., Bert and Shirley.

Ruth also attended Western Normal College and taught at several country schools in Fremont County until she married Arnold E. Scott on February 6, 1926. Arnold and Ruth began farming in Otoe County, Nebraska where their four children (Thomas, Donald, Richard and James) were born. In 1938, Ruth and Arnold returned to Fremont County to the Isaac Scott farm where they remained until Arnold's death in 1970 and Ruth's in 1993. The farm is now owned by Richard Scott (Grandson of Isaac) and farmed by Richard's son John Scott.

Several of Isaac and Annie Scott's grandchildren and their families still live in southwestern Iowa including: Paul Scott, Robert Lorimor, W. T. Lorimor, Jr., Bert Lorimor, Shirley Lorimor Schaaf, Donald Scott, Richard Scott and James Scott.

## JOHN AND CONNIE (KELLER) SCOTT

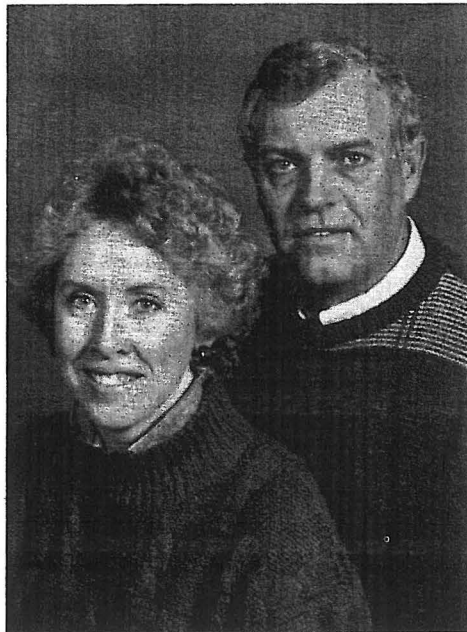

HON. ISAAC G. SCOTT

MR. SPEAKER—Your committee appointed to prepare resolutions commemorating the life, character and public service of Isaac G. Scott, beg leave to submit the following report:

The Honorable Isaac G. Scott, who was heretofore a member of the House of Representatives from Fremont county, Iowa, during the Thirty-fifth General Assembly, departed this life September 21st, 1921, and

*Whereas*, His record as a man, a legislator, a public official and a citizen, has been of the highest character, and

*Whereas*, it is fitting that we should recognize in some fitting manner the passing of this distinguished citizen.

*Therefore, Be It Resolved*, By the House of Representatives of the State of Iowa, that in the death of Isaac G. Scott, the State of Iowa has suffered a distinct loss.

Mr. Isaac G. Scott was born August 9, 1850, in Boone County, Indiana, of American parentage and Scotch Irish descent. When he was two years old his parents moved to Illinois and settled on a farm in North Henderson township, Mercer county. He received his education in the rural schools and has always lived on a farm and been engaged in farm-

ing. Moved to Iowa in 1876 and located on a farm in Fremont county. Was married to Miss Anna High of Fremont county in December, 1879. Had four children, two boys and two girls, who with the wife and mother still survive him. He was a member of the Methodist Episcopal church and the Masonic order, was township assessor for fifteen years and school treasurer for twelve years. Elected representative in 1912. A democrat in politics.

Mr. Scott was generous, big hearted and optimistic always, a hater of sham and a lover of integrity and right, a lovable neighbor, a kind husband and father, whose life has been such as to commend his example as an inspiration to those who follow after.

*Therefore, Be It Resolved,* That these resolutions be spread upon the Journal of the House and that the chief clerk be directed to send an engrossed copy thereof to the widow of the deceased.

HON. ABNER HALL EDWARDS

MR. SPEAKER—Your committee appointed to prepare resolutions commemorating the life and service of the Hon. Abner Hall Edwards, late of Audubon county, Iowa, beg leave to submit the following memorial:

Hon. Abner Hall Edwards, who represented Audubon county in the Twenty-sixth General Assembly, was born in Tamoyle, Illinois, September 14th, 1846. After a brief illness his death came March 1, 1923, at the age of seventy-six years, six months and thirteen days, after having spent forty years in the progress and development of our beloved commonwealth.

On May 17th, 1864, he enlisted in Company G, 13th Illinois Infantry, and received an honorable discharge in October of the same year. He came to Iowa thirty-nine years preceding his death, and settled in Douglas township, Audubon county, and engaged in farming. He was a staunch Republican, and was a leader in his home precinct, as well as being very active in state and national politics. His party honored him and for twenty years he held the office of justice of the peace. He was a Mason for fifty-two years preceding his death and had been past master of the blue lodge, past high priest of the chapter and past commander of the commandery. He was a man of integrity and was public spirited, quiet and unassuming in character, and loyal and generous in his display of friendship.

*Therefore, Be It Resolved,* That the House of Representatives of the State of Iowa, take this occasion to express its appreciation of the splendid character as well as the public services and benefactions of the deceased.

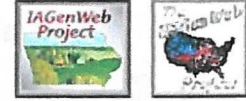
