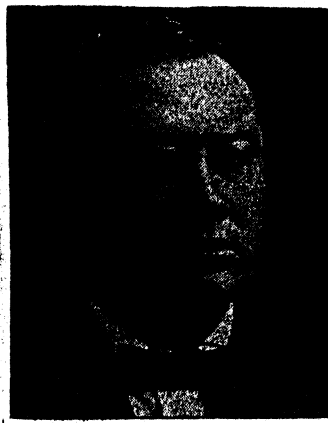

Verdict Goes To S. G. Stover

Plaintiff in Stover-Braun Case Receives Judgment of \$3,150 And Interest

The case of S. G. Stover vs. Genevieve Osborne Braun was decided in favor of the plaintiff in district court yesterday by a jury. Plaintiff received a judgment of \$3,150 plus interest.

The case involved a promissory note for \$3,000 signed August 20, 1932 in favor of Prull Bros. of Langworthy for repairs done by the latter on a house owned by the defendant.

Attorneys for the plaintiff contended that at the request of the defendant he had signed as surety for \$2,600 of the note, not as principal, and that when he paid off the note with interest at maturity he was entitled to payment of that amount from the defendant.

Counsel for the defense claimed that the defendant was principal for only \$400 of the note, and that the plaintiff had no case against the defendant for the \$2,600.

The case of Hora vs. Hunter in which the plaintiff asked for damages contending that Hunter hit him with a piston rod was decided in favor of the defendant and court costs of about \$100 were charged to the plaintiff. Both parties in the case were from Martelle.

The jury was made of LaVanche O'Hara of Oxford Junction, Quay Nims of Onslow, W. J. Zimmerman of Wyoming, Tobias Hinrichs of Monticello, Norman Bickel of Anamosa, Neal Turner of Anamosa, Henry Lorenzen of Wyoming, John Harness of Mechanicsville, J. H. Behrends of Monticello, and Mrs. James Connolly of Monticello.

Other cases which will be tried within the next few days before Judge J. E. Heiserman will be the state vs. McGrath, the latter being collected on by the City National bank of Clinton vs. Glenn.

J. H. J. Stutt, a well known farmer of Lovell township, died at his home last Friday at 12:30 p.m. He had suffered a heart attack at his home the preceding day and lapsed into unconsciousness until death ensued on Friday.

Funeral services for Mr. Stutt were held Tuesday afternoon at one o'clock at Zion Lutheran church in Wayne township. The church was filled to capacity by a large group of relatives and friends. The service was in charge of Rev. Henry L. Adix, pastor of St. Matthew's Lutheran church, assisted by Rev. F. H. Kehren, pastor of Zion Lutheran church. Interment was made in the cemetery adjoining the church.

Mr. Stutt was born in Wayne township, Jones county, May 3, 1867. He was a son of John and Mary (Harms) Stutt, both natives of Germany. His father came to this country in 1861 and served as a soldier in the Civil war. The subject of this sketch was reared in Jones county and attended the common schools. At the age of 22 he began his business career as a farmer. He first bought a farm in Wayne township and later bought a farm in Lovell township. At one time he was the owner of a 480 acre farm in South Dakota.

Mr. Stutt removed to his Lovell township farm in 1906 which was known as the old Hosford place. At one time he was greatly interested in threshing and owned a modern traction engine and also a large gasoline engine which was used as power for the threshing machine. He was also an extensive cattle buyer.

Married in 1889

Mr. Stutt was married to Catherine M. Zimmerman of Wayne township in 1889. Eight children were born to this union, four of whom survive: Clarence of Lovell township, Emil and George, living home farm, and Alva, of Phoenix, Arizona. Mrs. Stutt passed away May 1, 1908. On October 19, 1909 Mr. Stutt married Catherine M. Ealster, a native of Germany, who survives with his four sons. He is also survived by 14 grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

Politically Mr. Stutt allied himself with the democratic party but never evidenced a desire to participate in local politics. He was a member of the Lutheran church and when his health permitted attended its services.

State Representative

Mr. Stutt was elected state representative from Jones county and served during the period from 1910 to 1912. He was also president of the Jones County Trust and Savings bank from the time of its organization in January, 1916 until it was absorbed by the Monticello State bank in January, 1926.

He was a man of wide acquaintance and had many friends who will be eager to offer condolences to his family.

he sold his interest in the bank so that he could devote most of his time to real estate interests.

He was actively identified with various activities and enterprises in the community and was postmaster during the Taft administration. He served for several years on the board of supervisors of Emmet county. In the fall of 1916, he was elected to the State Legislature from Emmet county and served in the Thirty-seventh and Thirty-eighth General Assemblies.

Mr. Stuart was a member of over sixty years standing in the Masonic Lodge, and was one of the founders and charter members of Emmet Lodge No. 533.

He was a member of the Methodist Church, one of its official board members, and gave of his time and resources unsparingly to the church of his choice.

Mr. Stuart came to Armstrong on the first train that pulled into the station when the new town was established. 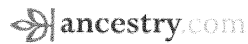

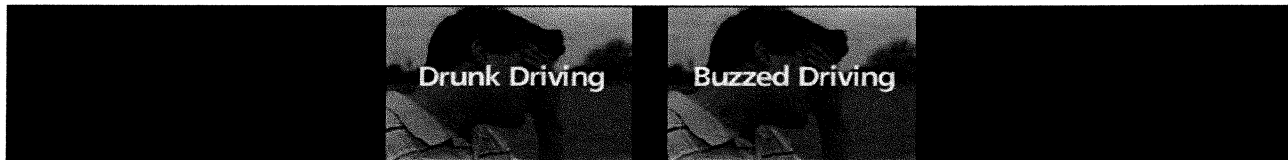
