Dr. C. A. Trumbauer Died Feb. 4 in Denver

We are indebted to Brice Sheriff of Hot Sulphur Springs, Colo., for the following clipping from the Denver Rocky Mountain News telling of the death of Dr. C. A. Trumbauer, former popular physician and real estate operator of Keota, who died there Feb. 4th. It is as follows:

Dr. Charles A. Trumbauer

A cerebral hemorrhage caused the death of Dr. Charles A. Trumbauer, 65, veteran Denver physician, in the Presbyterian hospital Tuesday. He had been in ill health for several months.

Born in Pennsylvania in 1871, he was graduated from an Iowa medical school and practiced in that state before coming to Denver 18 years ago.

He is survived by his wife, two daughters, Mrs. Esther Philip, and Llewellyn, and a son Meredith, all of Denver, and two brothers and five sisters of Waterloo, Iowa.

Funeral arrangements are in charge of the Olinger Mortuary.

Dr. Trumbauer came to the Keota community as a young man, studied for the ministry and did some preaching. He later became a physician, married a Keota girl, Miss LaRue Bryson, and he enjoyed a wide practice over much of Washington and Keokuk counties. About 25 years ago he gave up his practice and entered the business field, being very successful in the real estate business here and elsewhere. The family also for a time engaged in farming in southern Minnesota, near Waltham. Returning to the practice of medicine, they relocated in Denver which has since been his home. He had been in poor health in recent years, having suffered a previous stroke several years ago.

A brief note to The Eagle from Mrs. LaRue Trumbauer says the funeral was held Friday in Denver, a beautiful service.

MAIL CARRIERS HANDICAPPED

The three Keota mail carriers are not getting a vacation even though 95% of the roads are drifted. They are keeping quite busy organizing their routes so that those patrons who can get to town take numerous bundles of mail home with them. The distribution is effected by stages through co-operation among the farmer patrons. The farmers' outgoing mail is not handled so satisfactorily, however. Most of The Eagle's rural correspondents on Keota routes are not able to get their letters to us, and over all the north branch of the Rock Island the towns of South English, Kinross, Nira and Wellman are without mail, isolating them pretty completely, since they do not have either star mail route service or buses. They have had no trains for almost two weeks.

The Keota carriers say they are using twice as much gas as normal due to having to go so far out of the way to reach strategic points on their routes for meeting co-operating patrons. Wednesday morning the only roads open were No. 2, No. 77, the county gravel north to Chas. Kirkpatrick's, the east and west road from the gravel to Seventy-Six Center, and from No. 2 south to Nick Hahn's.

DR. C. A. TRUMBAUER DIED AT DENVER, COLO.

Word has just been received of the death from an apoplectic stroke of Dr. C. A. Trumbauer, which occurred yesterday at Denver, Colo. The funeral will be held there tomorrow. Dr. Trumbauer was a practising physician with Dr. Grose at Keota, Iowa, for a number of years. He went to Denver about 13 years ago and built up quite an extensive practice. His daughter, Esther (now Mrs. Phillips of Denver) at one time taught school in Oelwein and was well known to many here. He is a brother of Mrs. Louis Megow, 112 Fourth avenue NE. Aside from these relatives he also leaves his widow and another daughter, Miss Luellen, and son, Meredith, all living in Denver.

Mr. Trumbauer used to be quite active in Iowa politics and was a member of the state legislature from Keota, some 22 years ago. He was 64 years of age at the time of his death.

CHARLES A. TRUMBAUER

Charles A. Trumbauer, junior, partner of the firm of Smith & Trumbauer, hardware merchants, who are conducting business at Keota and at Wellman, Iowa. Mr. Trumbauer being in charge of the store at the latter place, was born in Berks County, Pennsylvania, November 30, 1870. His parents were A. F. and Mary E. (Romig) Trumbauer, both of whom were natives of Pennsylvania, where they resided continuously until 1884, and then came to Iowa, locating first in Buchanan county, where the father purchased, cultivated, and improved a tract of land. He is now living in Waterloo, this state, but his wife died on the 28th of October, 1896. They were the parents of ten children, namely: Joseph O., of Waterloo, Iowa, Ellen R., the wife of L. A. Megow, a resident of Oelwin, this state; Magdaline, of Lisbon, North Dakota; Charles A., of this review; Clara V., the wife of John P. Clue, of this state; Anna L., the wife of R. Nesbit, making their home in Blackhawk county, Iowa; Katie, the wife of J. D. Martin,

residing in Lisbon, North Dakota; James E., also of Waterloo, Iowa, and two died in infancy.

Charles A. Trumbauer was reared under the parental roof, remaining at home until eighteen years of age, when desirous of providing for his own support, he secured a position at the insane asylum in Independence, Iowa. He worked there as kitchen boy for six months when, realizing the need of further education as a preparation for the practical and responsible duties of life, he entered Central University at Pella, Iowa, and spend three years in study. Thus with broad literary knowledge to serve as the foundation for professional learning, he took up the study of medicine at Keokuk, Iowa, and was graduated from the Keokuk Medical College of that city with the class of 1897. Mr. Trumbauer located for practice in Harper, Iowa, where he remained for four and a half years and then moved to Keota, where he continued in practice for six and a half years. He then disposed of his practice and turned his attention to the hardware and implement business in partnership with L. H. Smith, under the firm style of Smith and Trumbauer. They are owners of one, large and well appointed store at Keota, also possessing another more extensive store at Wellman. The business is carefully conducted along legitimate lines of trade and their patronage is constantly increasing. Mr. Trumbauer has ever based his principles upon the rules which govern strict and unswerving industry and integrity and by reason thereof he has won substantial and gratifying success. He is not only interested in the two commercial establishments but is also the owner of a large farm of three hundred and fifty five acres on sections 5 and 6 Lime Creek and fifty five acres of sections 5 and 6, Lime Creek Township, from which he derives a substantial annual income.

On the 25th of March, 1897, Mr. Trumbauer was married to Miss Laura L. Bryson, who was born in this county, December 8, 1870, and is a daughter of John K. and Harriet (Bonner) Bryson, both of whom were natives of Pennsylvania. The parents are now living in Keota, Iowa. Their family numbered six children, including Mrs. Trumbauer, who by her marriage has become the mother of two daughters and one son: Esther L., Oliver M. and Louellen M. The parents are members of the Baptist church and are held in high esteem hereby all who know them by reason of their sterling personal worth. Mr. Trumbauer votes with the Democracy to which he has given his support since age conferred upon him the right of franchise, but is not an office seeker. Fraternaly he is connected with Keota Lodge, Mo. 353, A.F. & A. M. He is a man of energetic and persistent action, swift in his decisions, quick in perception and stable in purpose.

seven miles west of Burlington, where he was engaged in general farming and stock-raising for seven years. He then came to LaFayette township, Keokuk county, where he purchased a farm, which he conducted successfully until 1901, when he retired from active farm life and removed to Keota, where he is now living. He still owns three hundred and twenty acres in the home place, and has in all about five hundred acres of valuable land in this county.

The home of Mr. and Mrs. Keiser has been blessed with six children: William S., a prominent farmer of South Dakota; Samuel I. and Charles O., who are representative citizens of this county and are mentioned elsewhere in this work; Allie U., at home; Lola I., the wife of E. Gilbert, of Keota; and John D., who is operating the home farm. The parents are earnest and consistent members of the Methodist Episcopal church, in which Mr. Keiser is serving as trustee, and he belongs to Adelphi Lodge, Ancient Free and Accepted Mason of Keota. He is a stalwart Republican in his political views and is widely known as a leading and highly respected citizen of the county. His residence in the state covers more than half a century and thus he has been a witness of much of its growth and development. His has been a somewhat eventful career, in which there have been some exciting chapters, but wherever he has been and in whatever condition of life, Mr. Keiser has commanded esteem by his sterling worth and won friends by his genial nature and kindly disposition.

CHARLES A. TRUMBAUER, M. D.

Exacting demands are made upon the physician. Of him we demand not only a thorough knowledge of the medical science and marked skill

in his profession, but also a genial nature, a sunny disposition and kindly sympathy. Dr. Trumbauer, meeting these requirements, has already gained success as a member of the medical fraternity, although he is yet a young man. He was born in Berks county, Pennsylvania, November 30, 1870, and comes of a family of German lineage. His father, Addison Trumbauer, was born and reared in Pennsylvania and by occupation was a farmer. He removed to Iowa in 1884, locating in Independence, Buchanan county, on the 3d of April of that year. He now resides at Waterloo, this state. In early manhood he wedded Mary Romig, a native of Pennsylvania, who was of Holland descent and who died at the age of fifty-two years. This worthy couple were the parents of ten children, of whom five daughters and three sons are yet living.

Dr. Trumbauer is the fourth child and the second son of this family and was thirteen years of age at the time of their removal to Iowa. His education, which was begun in the schools of Pennsylvania, was continued in this state and for two years he was a student in the high school of Jesup, Iowa. When he was eighteen years of age his father gave him his time, and for five months thereafter he was employed in the insane hospital at Independence. He then entered Central College, at Pella, Iowa, where he pursued a three years' preparatory course. He then went to Kansas and entered the normal at St. John and in the fall of the same year became a student in the Keokuk Medical College, of Keokuk Iowa, where he was graduated in the spring of 1897. Dr. Trumbauer then located at Eldon, Iowa, where he remained for six months, and in August of the same year he took up his abode at Harper, in Keokuk county, Iowa, where he was in practice until January, 1902, when he located at Keota. He has already won recognition here by reason of his

skill in practice and his thorough understanding of the principles of the medical science.

On the 25th of March, 1897, the Doctor was united in marriage to Laura L. Bryson, a daughter of J. K. and Harriet (Dunham) Bryson. Socially the Doctor is connected with the Independent Order of Odd Fellows. In his political views he is independent when casting his ballot at local elections, supporting the men whom he thinks best qualified for office. He belongs to the Baptist church and is deeply interested in everything pertaining to the general good along social, intellectual and moral lines. His professional connection is with the Keokuk County Medical Society and he now has a good practice, being recognized as one of the leading physicians of the county.

H. H. REINERT.

H. H. Reinert is proprietor of the leading drugstore of Keota, an establishment which would be a credit to a city of greater size because of its neat and tasteful appearance, the excellent line of goods carried and the obliging courtesy of the proprietor. Mr. Reinert is one of Iowa's native sons, his birth having occurred in Sigourney, November 8, 1871. He is the fourth child of Michael and Mary (Horras) Reinert and comes of a family of German lineage. He was reared and educated in this state, pursuing his studies in the public schools of Sigourney, and he entered upon his business career in the capacity of a clerk with his brother, C. C. Reinert, at South English, in whose service he remained for two years. Later he was salesman in the employ of J. E. Graff, in Sigourney, and afterwards purchased his brother's store and conducted it for several years. He then became connected with the drug
