BEANS—Wellington Ira Beans, 89, former state representative and one of the organizers of the Prairie Farmers' Mutual Insurance Co. died at Mahaska hospital at 8 p. m. Friday, June 18, 1943. He leaves one son, Hoyt Beans of Oskaloosa, one daughter, Mrs. Zella Torbert of Lakewood, Fla., and one brother, Charles W. Beans of Lincoln, Nebr. Mr. Beans was born near New Baltimore, Ohio and came with his parents when a small boy to Indianapolis, Mahaska county in the fall of 1836. He received most of his education in the grade school at Indianapolis but later attended Oskaloosa college. He was married in the fall of 1880 to Miss Eva McCann who preceded him in death. Mr. Beans was a farmer and stock raiser as well as organizer of the above mentioned insurance company and president of the Farmer's National Bank in Oskaloosa. Funeral services will be held at the Powers funeral home at 3:30 p. m. Monday with Rev. Edgar L. Knight of the First Christian church in charge. Burial will be in the Indianapolis cemetery.
