Many Answer Grim Reaper's Dreaded Summons.

Recent Deaths Here and Elsewhere That Will Interest Marion County People.

Lyman L. Bybee, son of Jacob and Anna Mayer Bybee, was born April 3, 1856 in Kosloka county, Indiana, and died quietly at the Collins Memorial hospital Saturday, August 10, 1946, aged 90 years, 4 months and 7 days. At the age of 20, in 1876, he came to Marion county where he has since resided. He lived in Knoxville forty-two years.

On December 11, 1878, Mr. Bybee was united in marriage to Emma E. Bellamy. They celebrated their sixty-seventh wedding anniversary last December. To this union seven children were born, all of whom are living.

Mr. Bybee was sheriff of Marion county for five years, from 1902 to 1907. He was also a member of the city council for a number of years and served as representative in the thirty-fourth general assembly for two years.

in the Manhardt building and later an automobile business at the back of the store. In 1913 he built the James Motor Co. garage building. His Ford interests were sold in 1917, but Mr. Bybee still kept quite active in other business, mostly live stock, until 1942. He was the organizer and original president of the Consumers Oil Co., which office he held at the time of his death.

Mr. Bybee belonged to the I. O. O. F. lodge and was treasurer for many years; the Masonic lodge, the Commandery and the Knight Templars. He was a member of the Concord Methodist church and sang in the choir for many years.

Surviving relatives are his widow, seven children: Mrs. Gertrude Burdette, of Laura, Mont.; Lloyd L. Bybee, of Lamar, Colo.; Mrs. Anna Whitlatch, of Baldwin Park, Calif.; Allen P. Bybee, of Knoxville; Erwa A. Bybee, of Swan; Mrs. Stella S. Clark and Mrs. Othello B. Freeman, of Knoxville; twenty-one grandchildren and thirty-one great-grandchildren.

Funeral services were conducted by Rev. Paul Hann and Rev. M. M. Pigg from the Bybee & Davis Funeral Home, at 3 p. m., Monday. Interment was in Graceland cemetery.
