DENNIS P. HOGAN

Dennis P. Hogan, 80, long-time Omaha resident, died Friday, May 26, at San Antonio, Texas, where he had spent the winter. Death came after a lingering illness.

Mr. Hogan was born in Dubuque county, Iowa, Aug. 29, 1869, and moved to Adams county with his parents the following spring. He was one of 11 children born to the late Mr. and Mrs. Michael Hogan.

He organized the Farmers Savings Bank at Massena and for some time was the only employee. He was joined by Dolly Snelson, whom he later mar- ried at Massena, Oct. 9, 1901.

Always interested in farming and farm problems, his own farm in Cass County, Iowa, was rated highest in Iowa hog production in 1934 and was previously third on the list for many years.

In 1913 Mr. Hogan was a member of the Federal Agricultural Commission which was sent to Europe to study farm credit organization.

After the Federal Farm Loan Act was passed in 1916, Mr. Hogan was named president of the Omaha Land Bank, a position which he held for 19 years. He guided its growth until it became the largest in the land bank system.

Mr. Hogan served in the Iowa state legislature, and in 1937 he was named one of the Nebraska Republicans' two members of the "program committee of one hundred."

He was a member of the Pioneer group of the Rotary Club of Omaha.
