

Mr. Montgomery saw the development of this county and the state from primitive pioneer days up to the high type of modernity existing today. He farmed the virgin prairies of the state with oxen instead of with horses or tractor. His was a rich life in toil, social experience and progress, and his reminescences were most interesting.

He was married to Miss Mary Mellon in Pennsylvania in 1864, his bride being a cousin of Andrew Mellon, recent secretary of the national treasury. After coming to Fayette county two children were born to them and their home was not invaded by death until the passing of Mrs. Montgomery.

Mr. Montgomery served one term in the state legislature, being elected in 1885. He has twice represented the Dubuque presbytery in its general assemblies and has held membership in this denomination for more than 66 years.

He was a great lover of the beautiful and enjoyed his garden which he tended carefully as long as he was able. He enjoyed visiting with his fellow men and his last years were pleasant ones as he traveled down the hillside of life with quiet dignity. Independent as long as physical strength was given him to do for himself, he enjoyed life to a degree not attained by all. There are many old friends of many years standing who will recall his memory for helpful deeds rendered during Mr. Montgomery's active years in the community and mourn with his children the passing of this patriarch of Fayette county.

The funeral was held at the Presbyterian church, conducted by the pastor, the Rev. George DeF. Fisher, burial following by the side of his late wife in the West Union cemetery.

George W. Speer was born in Allegheny county, Pennsylvania, November 18, 1855, of American parentage of Scotch Irish descent. Both parents were also born in Pennsylvania. He died February 4, 1935.

He was reared on a farm and received a common school education. In the spring of 1887 he removed to Indianola, Warren county, Iowa, where he engaged in the abstract, real estate, loan and insurance business, which he continued until his final sickness.

Mr. Speer was married in 1905 to Miss Ethelda U. Nixon, of Page county, Iowa, who survives him and resides at Indianola. Mr. Speer has served his community two terms as city alderman, and many terms as notary public. He was elected as state representative in 1910, and served one term with distinct credit to himself and his county.

HONORABLE GEORGE C. STANZEL

George C. Stanzel was born in Clinton county, Iowa, on August 31, 1865. He moved to Sac county with his parents in the year 1876 and was educated in the public schools of that county. He passed away at his home in Sac City on April 18, 1935, after a lingering illness of several months.

He was united in marriage on February 19, 1894, to Miss Carrie Fulcher, who with their three children, Mrs. Florence M. Laudon, George A. Stanzel, and Fred E. Stanzel, mourn the death of their beloved husband and father.

Mr. Stanzel's interests have been primarily those of farming and although he retired from active farm work a number of years ago, he owns considerable Sac county land and gave it his individual attention.

In politics Mr. Stanzel was a republican and served as representative from Sac county in the Forty-fourth and Forty-fifth General Assemblies and in the Forty-fifth Extra Session. He also served as treasurer of the school board of Sac City, was a member of the city council, and a member of the K. P. Lodge.

Mr. Stanzel took an active interest in community affairs and held the highest regard and esteem of his fellowmen. He was a faithful public servant, always giving the best he had for the good of the greatest number of people. He was a kind and loving husband and father, devoted to making the home life as comfortable and as happy as possible for those dependent upon him. He was an attendant of the Methodist church and gave of his time and substance unstintingly.



George C. Call was born in Kossuth County, Iowa, September 24, 1860, and died in Sioux City December 18, 1934. His parents were Asa C. and Sarah (Heckart) Call, noted Kossuth County pioneers. He obtained his education at Algona and early turned his attention to real estate business and became a large land owner. He was active in civic affairs and was for a time mayor of Algona. In 1902 he removed to Sioux City, disposed of his properties in and around Algona, and soon became an extensive real estate owner in Sioux City and devoted much time and energy to forwarding that city's business interests. In 1916 he helped organize the Call Bond and Mortgage Company and at his death was its president. He early became an active advocate of the improvement of the Missouri River for navigation and worked incessantly for it. He labored for more equitable freight rates for his city, and for the improvement of the highways leading to Sioux City. He served as president of the Sioux City Real Estate Board, and was president of the Greater Sioux City Committee. For twenty years he was a member of the Board of Trustees of Morningside College.

Fergus I. Anderson was born near Ohio, Illinois, March 16, 1865, and died in Marion, Iowa, December 25, 1934. Burial was in Oak Shade Cemetery, Marion. His parents were Fenwick and Jeanette Peck Anderson. He acquired his education in rural public school. When seventeen years old he began to learn telegraphy and afterward was stationed as an operator at several points on the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul Railway, going to Marion in 1890 as a night operator. During leisure hours he took up the study of law and was graduated from the Ann Arbor Law School in 1894 and began practice in Marion. He served as city attorney of Marion for six years, and was mayor of the city. On September 1, 1921, Governor Kendall appointed him as one of the judges of the Eighteenth Judicial District in place of Milo P. Smith, resigned. By reason of elections he served for eight years, or until in 1929 when he resigned and returned to the practice of his profession.

George W. Speer was born in Allegheny County, Pennsylvania, November 19, 1855, and died in Indianola, Iowa, February 4, 1935. He was reared on a farm and received a common school education. In 1887 he removed to Indianola and engaged in abstract, real estate, loan and insurance business in which he continued until shortly before his death. He was a member of the Indianola City Council, was elected representative in 1910 and served in the Thirty-fourth General Assembly, was active in civic affairs of Indianola, was mayor of the city, and for several years was justice of the peace.

WILLIAM BIERKAMP was born in Hanover, Germany, September 18, 1849, and died in Durant, Cedar County, Iowa, December 13, 1934. Burial was in Durant Cemetery. He spent his boyhood in his native country, and migrated to the United States in 1868, settling at Davenport. There he attended a private school for a time and later entered






