Pioneer Dies



H. S. Boongaarden, a resident of this territory for more than 50 years, and long one of Lyon county's most prominent farmers and stockmen, died at his home here early yesterday morning, at the age of 91.

Mr. Boongaarden fell at his home a week ago, and suffered what appeared to be minor injuries. Pneumonia developed, and he failed rapidly until the time of his death on Wednesday.

Funeral services will be held Saturday at the Methodist church in this city, with Rev. A. C. Long in charge. Burial will be made in Riverview cemetery.

Seriously Hurt In Truck-Car Crash Thursday

Rollag Car Hits Semi-Trailer of Hogs Head-on Near Larchwood

Orville Rollag of this city was seriously injured last Thursday evening when his car drove head-on long into the front of an apple preaching truck, at the west edge of Larchwood.

In the accident Rollag suffered a near scalping as well as many bruises, cuts and contusions. His right leg was broken below the knee. He was brought to the VanderWill hospital in shock, but after being given blood plasma, etc. he rallied and will recover.

No Explanation

Sheriff Foltz and Corporal Lockwood were called to the scene of the accident shortly after it happened at 7:20 p. m., Thursday. According to the story Foltz gathered, Rollag was driving east from Sioux Falls. Just at the west edge of Larchwood a large semi-trailer truck loaded with hogs was going west. The truck was driven by Alvin Peterson of Pringham. When about 20 feet apart, Peterson says that Rollag's car turned directly into the truck.

Peterson pulled his truck as far in fact that it tipped over far in fact that it tipped over into the ditch. In the crash the front end of the Rollag car was badly smashed in and the truck was also extensively damaged. The sheriff's office placed damage to the car, a 1935 Ford Tudor, at \$300. Ten of the hogs in the load were killed.

Rites Saturday For A Pioneer Lyon Resident

H. S. Boomgaarden, 91 Years of Age at the Time of Death

Funeral services were held at the Methodist church in Rock Rapids on Saturday for H. S. Boomgaarden, a resident of this section for more than 50 years who passed away at his home in this city on April 10, at the age of 91.

Mr. Boomgaarden, a son of Mr. and Mrs. M. J. Boomgaarden, was born on November 30, 1854 in the province of Schleswig-Holstein, Germany. At the age of 7 he came to America with his parents, who first settled at Freeport, Ill.

In 1886 the family started for Iowa in a covered wagon, and they located near Parkersburg, in Grundy county.

On October 25, 1875 Mr. Boomgaarden married Miss Trena Schluter, and they made their home in Grundy county until 1890 when they came to Lyon county, taking over the "Boomgaarden section" west of this city. There the family home was made until 1918, when Mr. Boomgaarden retired and moved to this city.

Eleven children were born to Mr. and Mrs. Boomgaarden, five of them preceding their father in death. Survivors are W. H. Boomgaarden of Rock Rapids; Mrs. Wm. Poppingo and Edward Boomgaarden of Luverne; Ortwim Boomgaarden, Sheldon; Habbe Boomgaarden, Rushmore and Mrs. Henry Brewster, Austin, Minn.

Mr. Boomgaarden always found time to serve his community and his state. He was active in county politics for many years and in 1910 was elected to the state legislature, where he served with distinction.

On October 25, 1944, Mr. and Mrs. Boomgaarden observed their 60th wedding anniversary. Boomgaarden passed away on March 15, 1945 and since that
