HIRAM DEWELL DEAD

Former Representative Dies at His Home Near Clarence.

Wednesday morning, following an illness covering several months, Hiram Dewell passed away at his home northeast of Clarence. The funeral services will be held tomorrow afternoon at 2:30.

Mr. Dewell was born in Kosciusko county, Indiana, May 20, 1849. He came to this county with his parents in 1855 and has since been a resident, living in Dayton township. His life has been devoted to farming and he was eminently successful in that pursuit. He was a clean, honest and respected citizen of the county and had twice been honored by being chosen to represent the county at the state legislature.

He was married May 26th, 1870, to Miss Martha E. Ireland, of Jones Ce
