Ed J. Moore, Former Eldon Druggist, Dies

ELDON.—Edward J. Moore, 69, retired Eldon druggist and former member of the state legislature from Wapello county, died Friday evening at his home in Eldon. He had been in failing health but was not confined to his home.

He was born in Eldon, the son of David Marshall and Mary Elizabeth Moore, and graduated from Eldon high school in 1891. He operated a drug store in Eldon for many years, retiring three or four years ago. He once served as secretary of the state board of pharmacy.

Surviving are his wife, a daughter, Mrs. Virginia Baldwin of Montclair, N. J.; a brother, H. D. Moore of Western Springs, Ill., and two grandchildren.

The body is at the Campbell funeral home and arrangements for services are incomplete. The family requests that there be no flowers.
