POSTMASTER C. F. SWIFT PASSED AWAY SUDDENLY MONDAY

Was On A Visit To His Farm In Grove Township When End Came

While walking through the woods on his farm in Grove township Monday afternoon with his friend, Mr. Walter Well. Mr. C. F. Swift, picked up a piece of wood, remarking it would make good kindling, and dropped over dead. Death was instantaneous from acute heart failure, and occurred about three p. m. His sons Gaillard and Russell in this city were immediately notified and started for the farm. The body was brought here about 5:30.

Deceased had been suffering from this ailment for a long period, but man-like, he kept the knowledge to himself. He appeared in better health at lunch Monday and left about one for his farm. Death was hastened by his exertion in tramping over the rough ground. By previous agreement he had arranged the date for the dispatch of several items of business; the sale of stock and some timber cutting. The fatigue incident to the sales proved too much for him.

Mr. C. F. Swift was born in Davis county, Iowa, March 16, 1861. He received his education in the schools of his county and came to Harlan in 1882. He began teaching a country school and was so engaged when he was nominated to the office of county superintendent by the Democratic convention. This was the beginning of his political career. He served four terms in this position and entered the real estate business. He represented this county four years in the legislature and followed it with another four years as State Senator. At the close of this service he resumed active business in real estate until his appointment as postmaster following President Wilson's first election, succeeding Chas. A. Reynolds in this position. It is believed the responsibility and long hours of daily grind undermined his health. Mr. Swift was prominent in the Masonic lodge, which body will have charge of the funeral services.

Mr. Swift had a reputation as a wit. He was a good speaker and possessed of the gift of story telling. The humorous side of daily incidents always appealed to him.

July 22, 1896, he was united in marriage to Miss Tina Koolbeck, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Koolbeck at the home on south Sixth street. His wife, and all the children survive him. These are G. K. Swift, cashier of the Farmers & Merchants Savings Bank, this city; Mrs. Helen Mayne, Council Bluffs; attorney R. F. Swift, a member of the Shelby county bar; Miss Katherine, at home, a junior in the high school.

Funeral services will be held at the home on Baldwin street this afternoon at 2:30, conducted by Parian Lodge, A. F. & A. M., Mt. Zion Commandery, K. T., acting as an escort Interment in the city cemetery.

Rev. A. S. Heister, Estherville, rector of Grace Episcopal church, served as chaplain. The pall bearers were: L. C. Lewis, L. M. Kerr, Carl McNaughton, T. H. Smith, T. H. Potter, Dr. M. S. Overfield. Business houses were closed from two to four.

F. F. Wunder, referee, was given authority to lease the farm known as the Jas. I. Miller estate, until such time as it could be sold profitably.

The suit of H. A. Tague vs. Drainage District No. 10 was dismissed at his own cost.

Similar action was taken in the matter of E. D. Oakes vs. Drainage District No. 11.

The offer of D. Torpy to confess judgment in favor of Emerson Brantingham Co. for \$14.00 and cost was accepted.

Harry Bailey was given a divorce from Florence E. Bailey.

Judgment for amount claimed, \$89.15, with costs, was given in favor of T. G. Muller thru Wm. Hoegh, Adm., against Ernest and Christie Petersen.

In J. W. Robinson vs. Otto Sorensen and Chris Hess, the jury returned a verdict for plaintiff of \$75.00, signed by Jennie Morris, foreman.

Jas. Carlsen, defendant, was given a verdict against Chris Brodersen, plaintiff, by the jury.

The case of Ernestine Baker vs. Emma and August Bucholtz was taken under advisement by agreement.

Panama Savings Bank vs. Thos. C. and Catherine Mamhart; ordered issued for sale of attached real estate.

The suits of Mary E. Kasner, Adm. vs. Bentena Frederickson; F. A. Albertus vs. C. E. Pingel were dismissed at costs of plaintiffs.

Deen Loom Co. vs. C. R. I. & P. Co. A confessed judgment of \$100 and costs was accepted.

L. S. Myrtue was given judgment for note in suit against Fred G. Gearhart.

W. E. Cooper was made permanent guardian of Mary Grauel, and the case transferred to probate docket.

B. W. Gregory et al vs. Board of Supervisors. Plaintiffs elected to stand on court's ruling to demurrer. Dismissed and costs divided.

Booth Motor Co. vs. I. A. Cuppy; judgment for plaintiff for note in suit.

Ethan Jacobsen et al vs. Mary Jacobsen. Defendant was found to be of unsound mind. E. A. Schell was named permanent guardian, under bond of \$75,000.

Three blue sky cases were disposed of, all in favor of the purchasers. These were McBride vs. Hissen and Sun Manfg. Co., Muenbrath vs. Luetticke et al; McCortle vs. Luetticke, et al. The first case was disposed of by a jury. Ada Gould, foreman; the others were settled by agreement.

John Kvamme vs. Francis Hemmlager. This is a case of a land sale before the affliction of normalcy set in. Defendant made a payment down but has been unable to meet succeeding payments. He is given until Jan. 2, 1922, to pay \$10,000 with interest and costs.

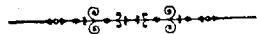

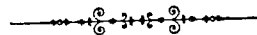

common schools and in St. Francis' College, Quincy, Ill. In 1882 he came to Harlan and bought a half interest in his present store; the firm name was then Haak & Beh; this partnership continued for two years, when Mr. Beh purchased his partner's interest, and has since conducted the business alone. He carries the largest stock of goods in Harlan and occupies two rooms. Mr. Beh was married October 10, 1882, to Miss Louisa D. Dietz, a native of Scott County, and a daughter of Hon. Philip and Dora (Reison) Dietz, who came from Germany in 1853; they located in Johnstown, Pennsylvania, where they lived for two years, and in 1855 they came to Walcott, Scott County, Iowa, where they still reside. Mr. Dietz is a member of the firm of Stockdale & Dietz, who are extensively engaged in grain and stock dealing. Mr. Dietz represented Scott County in the twenty-first and twenty-second general assemblies. Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Beh are the parents of two children—Dora F. and Philip C. Mr. Beh is a member of the Roman Catholic church.



C F. SWIFT, County Superintendent of Schools, Harlan, came to Shelby County in 1882. He is a native of Iowa, born in Davis County, March 16, 1861, and is a son of Washington S. and Louvina Jane (Dunlavy) Swift. The former is a native of Wayne County, Indiana, and is a son of Curren E. Swift, a native of Kentucky, of English ancestry, who came with his family to Iowa at an early day, and now lives in Wayne County. Louvina Jane Swift, wife of Washington Swift, is a native of Indiana, and a daughter of James D. Dunlavy, a native of Kentucky, and of English descent, who came to Iowa in the early settlement of the

country. Washington Swift grew to manhood on a farm and was married in Davis County; after his marriage he followed agricultural pursuits, and still resides in Davis County. He and his wife are the parents of eight children, three sons and five daughters. C. F. Swift, our subject, lived on a farm until he was sixteen years old, when he went to the Southern Iowa Normal and Commercial Institute, at Bloomfield; he completed the teacher's course and pursued the scientific course one year, after which he engaged in teaching in Davis County. In March, 1882, he came to Shelby County and engaged in teaching, which he followed until his election to the office of county superintendent of schools, in the fall of 1885; he was re-elected in 1887, and is the present incumbent. Mr. Swift was married in 1886, July 22, to Miss Tina E. Koolbeck, a native of Marion County, Iowa, and a daughter of John Koolbeck, of Harlan. By this union two children were born—Gaillard and Helen. Mr. Swift is a member of the A. F. & A. M., Parian Lodge, No. 321; Olivet Chapter, No. 107, and is also a member of the Knights of Pythias, Carthage Lodge, No. 65. Mrs. Swift is a member of the Methodist Episcopal church. Politically he affiliates with the Democratic party.

HON. CURRAN FREEMAN SWIFT

MR. SPEAKER: Your committee appointed to prepare suitable resolutions commemorating the life and services of the Honorable Curran Freeman Swift, of Shelby county, member of the House of Representatives in the Thirty-second and Thirty-third General Assemblies, beg leave to submit the following memorial:

Curran Freeman Swift was born in Davis County, Iowa, March 16, 1861, and spent his early boyhood in that county, attending district school in season. Later he took a teacher's course in the Southern Iowa Normal and Commercial Institute at Bloomfield and later a course in science.

He came to Shelby county in the year 1882 and began his career as a teacher and so well did he perform his duties, that he was later chosen county superintendent of schools and served two terms. During this service he acquired a taste for politics, which remained with him all through life. His office holding record included, besides the county superintendency heretofore mentioned, many years as a member of the Board of Education of the Independent District of Harlan; two terms as mayor of Harlan, member of the Iowa legislature in the Thirty-second and Thirty-third General Assemblies and was postmaster at the time of his death.

Of all men who have grown up in western Iowa, none contributed more to the upbuilding of the country and there was hardly a worthy enterprise undertaken but that his name and influence were not taken into consideration. His was indeed a life of usefulness, the possessor of a great personality, strong physically, mentally, and possessed of wonderful persuasive powers and of more than average ability as a speaker. He had an active sense of humor and, as a mimic, had few superiors.

He was a thirty-second degree Mason, and Past Master of Parian Lodge, Past High Priest of Olivet Chapter, Past Commander of Mt. Zion Commandery and a member of Za Ga Zig Temple of Des Moines.

Mr. Swift owned and managed quite a large farm during his life, in connection with his other business and took pride in the pure-bred stock which he owned.

He was not an old man, only in the prime of life, when the Supreme Ruler summoned him and gathered him unto his fold. It may be truly said of him:

"Large was his bounty and his soul sincere,
Heaven did a recompense as largely send;
He gave to misery, 'twas all he had—a tear,
He gained from Heaven, 'twas all he asked, a friend."

He gave to his community, his city, state and nation, largely of his time, his talents and his love. He sought no greater reward than the reward of faithful friends, which he gained in large measures.

Be It Resolved, By the House of Representatives of the Forty-first General Assembly, That in the passing of Honorable Curran Freeman Swift, this Assembly express its realization of the loss of one of the leaders in the state, a man of strong character and sterling worth, a man

of high ideals in Christian living, and the House would tender by this resolution, its sympathy to the family who survives.

Be It Further Resolved, That a duly enrolled copy of this resolution be forwarded to the family of the deceased.

HON. ROBERT J. JOHNSTON

MR. SPEAKER: Your committee appointed to prepare a memorial resolution commemorating the life, character and public service of Robert J. Johnston, of Humboldt County, Iowa, beg leave to submit the following:

Robert J. Johnston was born on the present site of Pittsburgh, Pa., January 13, 1856, and died November 2, 1924.

His parents, John and Jane (Porter) Johnston, were of Scotch-Irish ancestry.

He came to Iowa with his parents in the spring of 1856. They settled in the vicinity of Springvale (now Humboldt) which was his home during his entire life.

He was educated in the public schools of Humboldt and Humboldt College. He served as deputy county treasurer for one term, resigning that office in 1883 to enter the banking business. He was for several years chairman of the republican county central committee. He served for a number of years as a director of the State Agricultural Society and closed his term of service with the society by serving two years as vice president and one term as president.

He was a republican in politics and served in the House of Representatives in the Thirty-sixth and Thirty-seventh General Assemblies. He was married June 27, 1888, to Mary H. Stoddard. He is survived by his wife. The last act of his life was to make a stirring speech setting forth the principles of the republican party.

Therefore, Be It Resolved, That in the passing of the Honorable Robert J. Johnston, the state has lost a valuable and honored citizen, a man of strong character and sterling worth and the House would tender by this resolution its sympathy to the widow who survives.

Be It Further Resolved, That a copy of these resolutions be spread upon the Journal of the House as an expression of the life and worth of the deceased and copies thereof be transmitted to the widow of the deceased.

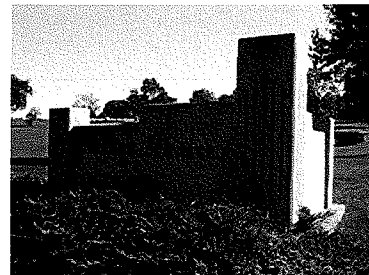

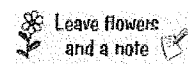
