DEATH SUMMONS JAMES L. WARREN

FORMER STATE SENATOR AND AT ONE TIME A CITIZEN OF THIS CITY NOW OF DES MOINES VICTIM OF APOPLEXY.

James L. Warren, 65 years old, former state senator, died Saturday morning, May 16th at his home, 1547 Fourth street, Des Moines. Death followed an attack of apoplexy.

The many friends of “Line” as he was familiarly known among them in Pella and community, will receive the news of his death with regret. For many years he practiced law in this city with his brother, Granville. Some years later his brother passed away and the law practice was continued by J. L. Warren. During his residence here, he was elected by the citizens of the county as a member of the House of Representatives from 1904 to 1908. In 1919 he moved with his family to Des Moines where he practiced law. A few years ago he suffered from a stroke of apoplexy which hindered him considerably in his business and he finally retired. His death came suddenly and quite unexpected to his loved ones and close friends.

He was born at the old Warren homestead, near the Warren Mill bridge northeast of this city and upon arriving at young manhood he decided to attend college and was a student at Penn at Okauchosa and he was admitted to the bar in that city. Later he came to Pella where he made his home for twenty years.

He is survived by his widow, two daughters, Mrs. William J. Kincaid of Grand Junction and Miss Helen Warren of Des Moines; two sisters, Mrs. S. F. Prouty and Miss Lillian Warren, both of Des Moines and two brothers, R. W. Warren of Kansas City and O. E. Warren of Springfield, Missouri.

Funeral services were held at the Dunn’s funeral home Tuesday morning May 19th at 10:30 o’clock.

SENATOR WARREN

DIES SUDDENLY

FORMER REPRESENTATIVE AND
SENATOR FROM MARION CO.
DIES IN DES MOINES.

STRICKEN BY APOPLEXY

Served Marion County Eight Years in
Iowa Legislature—Two Terms Representative, One Senator.

Ex-Senator James L. Warren, for many years a prominent lawyer and political leader in this county, died at his home in Des Moines on Sunday morning, May 17, at the age of 65 years. Death followed an attack of apoplexy.

Senator Warren was born in Marion county, near Pella, and spent most of his life in this county, moving to Des Moines in 1917. He attended the public schools at Pella and Penn college in Oskaloosa and was admitted to the bar in that city. Later he returned to Pella and engaged in the practice of his profession. He early took an active interest in politics and became a leader. In 1900 he was elected representative on the republican ticket and was reelected in 1902. So well did he please the people in his legislative service that two years later he was nominated and elected state senator, serving until 1908.

Senator Warren is survived by his widow, two daughters, Mrs. William J. Kincaid of Grand Junction and Miss Helen Warren of Des Moines; two sisters, Mrs. S. E. Prouty and Miss Lillian Warren, both of Des Moines and two brothers, R. W. Warren of Kansas City and O. E. Warren of Springfield, Mo.

Funeral services were conducted at Dunn's funeral home Tuesday morning at 10:30 o'clock.
