Former Sabula Mayor, Legislator Dies At An Advanced Age

Hon. A. E. McDole, for several terms mayor of Sabula and a former Jackson county legislator, died at 4:20 o'clock Thursday afternoon at the home of his daughter, Mrs. John M. Chafer near Keosauqua, Iowa, after a lingering illness due to the infirmities of advanced age.

Funeral services were conducted at two o'clock Sunday afternoon at the Methodist church in this city, the Rev. J. J. Hoffman officiating. Pallbearers were John Kunau, M. C. Harmsen, F. H. Wulff, Chas. Shepler, Paul Papke and J. T. Thompson. Hymns were sung by Mrs. F. E. Bryant and Mrs. Fred Norskow with Mrs. A. E. Brown accompanying them. The flowers were taken care of by Mrs. Ira Kyhl and Mrs. Anna Keller. Resurgam Lodge, No. 169 A. F. & A. M., was in charge of the services at the cemetery.

Upon approaching manhood Mr. McDole obtained employment with the lumber firm of E. & M. H. Long in Sabula and for a number of years was foreman of their lumber yard. For one and a half years he served in a similar capacity for the Clinton Lumber company in Clinton. In March, 1888, he purchased a livery business in Sabula which he successfully conducted for a number of years. During these years he built two fine residences in Sabula and did his part in the upbuilding of the town.

In March, 1907, Mr. and Mrs. McDole moved to a farm they had purchased near Navina, Okla., after farming near this city for several years. They returned to Sabula in 1915 and remained here until 1933 when, due to Mr. McDole's health and advanced age they went to Keosauqua to make their home with their only child, Mrs. John M. Chafer.

During his many years of residence in Sabula, Mr. McDole was active in public life. He served on the school board and town council, as assessor, several terms as mayor and was honored by the citizens of Jackson county by election to the Iowa House of Representatives in which he served during the 30th and 31st General assemblies. To him a public office was a public trust and he acquitted himself honorably and to the satisfaction of his constituents in these various offices. Mr. McDole was a public spirited citizen in every way and could always be depended upon to do his share in movement for the good of his community. Possessed of a congenial personality and ready wit he was a great favorite with old and young. Fraternally Mr. McDole was prominent in the Masonic order and the Modern Woodmen of America.

Mr. McDole was the last of a family of nine children, three sons and six daughters, of Jeremiah and Catherine McDole. He is survived by his wife, the daughter, Mrs. Lucy Chafer; two grandchildren, Bert Chafer, of Keosauqua, and Mrs. Jeannette Workhoven, of Sioux City, and three great grandchildren. He also leaves a number of nieces and nephews.

Day there were born six children, four of whom are living, namely: Albert L., Glenn S., Sylvia M., and an infant son named Cliff. One daughter, Elsie, died at the age of five years, and Nellie died when one year old.

Mr. Day, politically, votes the straight Republican ticket, and has been quite prominent in local affairs, holding the offices of City Recorder, Assessor and Township Collector, and is at present a member of the Council. He has officiated as President of the School Board, and is the Tax Collector for Union Township. He also has the agency of the American Express Company, and the Diamond Joe line of steamers. Socially, he belongs to the Modern Woodmen and the A. O. U. W. In religious matters he is a member in good standing of the Methodist Episcopal Church.

ALBERT E. McDOLE, one of the younger members of the community of Sabula, operates a livery and transfer line, and enjoys a lucrative patronage among the people of Union Township. He is wide-awake and enterprising, and evidently on the highway to prosperity. He was born in Cortland County, N. Y., March 29, 1850, and was the son of Jeremiah and Catherine (Esmay) McDole, the former a native of Cattaraugus County, N. Y., and who emigrated to Iowa in 1853, with his family, settling in Sabula, which was then in its infancy. He was a farmer by occupation, and remained a resident of this vicinity until his death, which occurred Dec. 13, 1873. The mother is still living in Sabula.

To the parents of our subject there were born nine children, three sons and six daughters, five of whom are living: Albert and Albertus were twins, and were the seventh birth in the family; the latter is now farming in Washington Territory. Harriet (Mrs. Spring), Mary (Mrs. Smith), and Phebe (Mrs. Seeber), are all residents of Sabula.

The subject of this notice was but three years old when he was brought by his parents to this county, and received his early education in the schools of Sabula. Upon approaching manhood


he was occupied at the lumber business, and in due time became foreman of the lumber yard at this place, which position he held for a period of fourteen years. For one and one-half years he also served in this capacity with the Clinton Lumber Company. He was married, July 7, 1875, in Sabula, to Miss Jennie, daughter of George and Adeline Canfield. Mrs. McDole was born March 6, 1857, in Union Township. Her parents were natives of New York, and are now living at Sabula. Mr. and Mrs. McDole are the parents of one child, Lucy C., who was born Aug. 8, 1881.

Our subject purchased his livery stock and outfit on the 20th of March, 1888, investing a capital of over \$1,600. The business prior to this time had not been especially successful; but Mr. McDole is building it up to goodly proportions. He keeps an excellent assortment of horses and vehicles, while his stables are kept in good order, and his employes have a full understanding of their business. Politically he votes the straight Republican ticket, and is a member of the School Board. He was elected Township Trustee in 1888, but declined to serve, having no desire for the cares and responsibilities of office. He has, however, at times, served as Street Commissioner and Road Supervisor. Socially, he belongs to the Modern Woodmen and Masonic fraternity. Although not a member of any church, he contributes to the support of the Gospel, and believes in the maintenance of Christian institutions. Mrs. McDole is a member in good standing of the Methodist Episcopal Church. They occupy a snug home in the west part of town, and enjoy the friendship and acquaintance of a large portion of its best people.

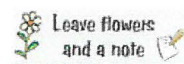
