NELLIE LANGENSTEIN MARRIED

"Uncle Jeff" was never failing in courteous, good nature and help of any kind for everyone. He was indeed a man known by everyone in the vicinity. For years engaged in mercantile business in Bloomfield, he established a large acquaintanceship, and won the highest esteem and regard from the entire circle of his customers and other friends.

There were five children in the
family, the oldest of which Luticia
A., was married to William McClure
at the age of 18, and T. J., made
his home with her from the age of
14, until he was married in the year
1855 to Jane Wilkinson, daughter of
Aaron Wilkinson. She died in 1860.
To this union were born four child-
ren, two of whom died in infancy,
and one son lived to the age of 21
years, and Orpha the oldest daughter
died July 27, 1903.

On April 24, 1862, he was married
to Elsie Lynch, and to this union
were born eight children, four of
the sons still living are; John,
Thomas, Robert and Ira. Delilah,
the oldest child, and only daughter,
born to this union died at the age of
19. The deceased was the last
member of his father's family, so
that in his death the entire family
have passed away. As an evidence
of his nobleness of life and worth of
character as recognized by his fel-
low citizens he was elected a mem-
ber of the Board of Supervisors in
1884 and filled that office until
January 1891. He was also elected
a member of the City Council in
which position he served from 1891
until 1894. In November 1903 he
was elected State Representative,
which office he filled at the time of
his decease. He was a member of
the church for 36 years, and for 16
of these years a member of the
First Methodist church in Bloom-
field.


