ONE-TIME MAYOR OF CITY DEAD IN PALO ALTO, CAL.

Alva C. Hobart Succumbs at Age of
74 Years.

Alva C. Hobart, one time mayor of Cherokee and prominent in northwest Iowa politics, died Saturday at his home in Palo Alto, California, aged 74. Burial will be at Palo Alto with funeral services conducted by the Masonic fraternity.

Mr. Hobart was a son of Caleb E. P. Hobart, one of Cherokee's earliest business men, engaged in the lumber and coal trade. The son engaged in the practice of law. Alva Hobart in this city, served as county attorney from 1892 to 1894 and served the city of Cherokee as mayor.

Later he represented this district in the state senate and was an unsuccessful candidate for the republican nomination for attorney general. Going to the west coast he located at Palo Alto, California, where he continued to practice law and participated actively in public affairs. He served that city as mayor and occupied other positions of public trust.

He was a past master of Speculative lodge, No. 307, A. F. & A. M. of Cherokee.
