COOPER PREACHES TO A. L. SENIORS

DECLARES WORLD IS CALLING FOR PURITY, CONSECRATION, SACRIFICE.

TES BIBLE EXAMPLES

The world is calling for separation, purity, consecration and sacrifice as portrayed by Abraham, Joseph, Saul of Tarsus and Jesus, more loudly than it did in biblical times. Rev. Francis E. Cooper, pastor of the First Baptist church, told members of the Abraham Lincoln high school graduating class at the baccalaureate services held at the Broadway theater Sunday morning.

"Our worth in life will be measured not by our personal happiness, but by our personal service," he said.

Abraham exemplified separation, Rev. Mr. Cooper said.

"Some of you students will no doubt have to separate yourselves from some of 'the gang' if you are to do the work your expect to," he added.

Joseph, who was sold into slavery and later placed in a position of trust by his master, was tempted, but did not fall because of his master's confidence in him, Rev. Mr. Cooper said. He exemplified purity.

"One of the greatest temptations to anyone is to wear a beautiful dress, but it takes character and purity to wear a beautiful soul."

LONG-TIME RESIDENT SUC- CUMBS IN BLUFFS HOS- PITAL; FUNERAL TUES.

John J. Jenks, 75, Avoca, Ia., president of the Avoca State bank, died at a local hospital Sunday evening after a short illness.

Mr. Jenks, who had been a resi- dent of Avoca since 1878, started his career as a cattle raiser near the city in 1879. In 1892 he joined the bank as cashier.

He is survived by his widow, Anne Jenks; one daughter, Mrs. Florence Knutson of Hinsdale, Ill.; one sister, Mrs. Ida Currier of Au- rora, Ill., and one grandchild.

Funeral services will be held Tuesday at 2 p. m. at the residence in Avoca. The body will be shipped to Earlville, Ill., for inter- ment Wednesday.
