Peter W. Conley died at his home in Volga township, Thursday, Jan. 8th, from hardening of the arteries after a lingering illness of several months.

He was born on April 18th, 1868, in Volga township, the son of Michael Conley and Julia Needham. On February 27, 1900, he was united in marriage to Miss Esther Downey at Garnaville. To this union six children were born, Harold, Raymond, Mary, John, Lucille and Daniel, all of whom are still at home.

Mr. Conley was at one time very prominent in the Democratic politics of the county, having served as representative from this county in the twenty-seventh and twenty-eighth General Assemblies, which were held in 1898 and 1900.

He was a member of the Catholic church of Garber, where the funeral was conducted by the Rev. Wm. Goetzinger on Monday, January 12. Interment was made in the Garber cemetery. He was a member of the Knights of Columbus lodge of Elkader and about forty members of the order attended the funeral in a body.

The annual meeting of the Farmers Cooperative Creamery was held in McGregor at the Community rooms, Wednesday, Jan. 7th. A board of directors meeting was held in the forenoon and a big dinner served at noon by the wives of the patrons.

In the afternoon the annual business election was held. Officers elected were as follows:

President, R. G. Kinsley; vice president, Eric Johnson; secretary, Jno. C. Heilman; treasurer, F. S. Richards; directors: F. L. Becker, Henry Coobs, Andrew Trygg, Eric Johnson and R. G. Kinsley.

The creamery had a very successful year, making 232,458 lbs. of butter; 187,220.6 lbs. of butterfat was received at the creamery; 29,914 lbs. of milk was received at the creamery.

The average test was 28.24%. Overrun 23.43%. Average price paid for butterfat 39.22 cents.
