The Schuck family were the first farmers in Grundy county to raise field corn on a small scale. Other farmers who lived here at that time thought that section of the county too far north to grow a good crop of corn. The first crop of corn planted by the Schuck family turned out to be a heavy yield that matured well and from that time on other farmers grew corn on a large scale.

There were eight children in the original Schuck family who came to this county. There are only two of them now living, Conrad Schuck and his sister, both of whom reside in Parkersburg. Conrad Schuck is the oldest of the eight children. He is in his eightieth year and he feels and looks well and enjoys driving about in the car as much now as he did 20 years ago. The parents of this large pioneer family, Mr. and Mrs. Adam Schuck, are buried in the cemetery adjoining the Heinrich Lutheran church in Shiloh township.
