Control of Mosquitos  
Varies With the Type

Although to most people a Mosquito is just a humming in- sect which goes around punctur- ing skins, there are many differ- ent kinds of them, says the U.S. Department of Agriculture. There are mosquitos which breed in old tin cans containing water and in rain barrels, mos- quitos which breed in swamps and ponds, mosquitos which are found in clear cool water, and mosquitos which are most at home in the stagnant water of sewers.

Workers use this knowledge of the different mosquitos in their campaigns to eradicate the pest. For one type of mosquito they concentrate on the rain barrels, tin cans, and other receptacles near homes. Often water-lily ponds or stock ponds are breed- ing places of mosquitos. Here the placing of top-water minnows or goldfish is effective, for all mosquitos pass through a "wiggie tail" or "wiggler" stage frequently the mosquitos breed in swamps and ditches. If it is too
