OBSEQUIES OF F. E. MALLOY

Remains of Dubuque County's State Senator Interred To-day at Ossian.

WHERE HIS PARENTS ARE BURIED

Was From One of Winneshlok's Oldest And Most Respected Families—Funeral Was Largely Attended.

The remains of State Senator F. E. Malloy were buried this morning at Ossian, Ia., in the family lot, where repose his father and mother, Bennett Bros., who prepared the remains for interment, shipped them to Ossian Wednesday morning at 6 o'clock and a committee of the Dubuque County Bar association accompanied them. The Telegraph's special correspondent at Ossian sends an account of the obsequies there, as follows:

Ossian, Ia., Feb. 2. Special to the Telegraph: All that is mortal of the late Senator F. E. Malloy, of Dubuque, arrived at Ossian, his old home, and were at once removed to the home of his birth, where they lay in state until the time of the funeral, which occurred at 9 o'clock this (Thursday) morning. During this interval a large number of friends from all parts of this locality paid their last tribute to one of Iowa's brightest young men and a member of Winneshlok county's oldest and most respected families.

The funeral occurred from St. Francis de Sales Roman Catholic church, the impressive service of the beautiful requiem high mass being conducted by the pastor Rev. Father McCarthy, assisted by neighboring clergy and an enlarged choir.

The funeral sermon was preached by Father McCarthy and was a fitting tribute to the sterling worth of one of Iowa's brightest young men.

The deceased was a member of several civic organizations, among which was the Order of the Modern Woodmen. The local camp assisted by many members from neighboring camps attended the funeral.

The pallbearers were made up of the following gentlemen, the first four being members of the Dubuque bar, and intimate friends of the deceased: Thos. H. Duffy, J. W. Kintzinger, J. P. Franzen, John Howe, W. F. Cody, and T. P. Baxter.

In the passing of Senator F. E. Malloy, little can be added by the writer to what has already been said in encomiums of the excellence of his character and ability. Suffice it to say that here, where almost his entire life was spent, the entire community is in mourning for the young and promising life that went out so soon, and all breathe fervently the last prayer for a departed spirit—"May the Lord Have Mercy on His Soul."
