"MR. SMITH, OF HARRISON."



Hon. George H. Smith, reformer and statesman, and at present a member of the lower body of the Iowa legislature, is about the most well known member of the house. He, a farmer by profession, hails from Harrison county, and gets his mail and groceries at the village of Persia. Rumor has it, however, that on certain state occasions, as, for example, upon his departure for the capital city for the purpose of assisting in the work of legislation, Mr. Smith prefers to take the train at the town of Portsmouth, in the neighboring county of Shelby. Doubtless, this is merely an idiosyncrasy, to which great men are often given. The rumor that it is because of a railroad pass, to which Mr. Smith announced himself as sternly opposed in the last campaign, is discredited, as clearly not in keeping with Mr. Smith's pronounced

tenets on reform. Indeed Mr. Smith is an "out and out" reformer. This is his first term in the legislature, and there has not been much time yet for a new member to show his colors, but there is no doubt that the member from Harrison talks reform at every opportunity. It is true he has been playing in rather hard luck, up to date, as of the twenty-seven or so measures he has so far introduced to regulate governmental affairs, both state and national, none of them have gotten farther than the clerk's desk. But Mr. Smith is steadily persevering, and, as he says in a letter to his home paper, that he is "devoting his time to the service of the people of Harrison county, not only during the day, but by lamplight, long after the majority of them are asleep," it is safe to predict that before the session is ended there will be something done.

KILLED 'EM

Chinese Mob Murders 1
German Sailors.

MAY BRING ON WAR

Germany Will Undoubtedly Demand More Concessions from the Chinese.

RUSSIA WAS TOO SLOW

While Dickering Over a Loan to China, Great Britain Stepped in and Secured Prestige.

SHANG HAI, Jan. 28.—The Chee F. dispatch gives the details of the killing of a number of German sailors by the Chinese. A sailor named Schulz, 16, belonging to the Cruiser Kaiser, was assassinated by the Chinese rabble when on outpost duty at Tsimo, the extreme German post at Kiao Chou Bay.

The head was severed from the body. When the crime was discovered the relieving corporal and the guards they were also attacked by hundred the natives. The guards defend themselves as best they could but it reported all were killed after they had killed twelve Chinese.

The greatest excitement prevails at Kiao Chou.

It is believed the incident will form the basis of further German demands on China.

Russia Outwitted.

LONDON, Jan. 28.—A Peking dispatch says that after Russia had offered China a loan on the British terms, China asked Russia to defend her against the possible displeasure of Great Britain. Russia replied evasively; but a similar guarantee asked of Great Britain against Russia was promptly agreed to.

A Shang Hai dispatch says that a Russian fleet at Port Arthur is helpless for want of coal and unable to steam even to Vladivostock. The Japanese coal firms which contracted to supply the Russian fleet have defaulted.

PEKIN, Jan. 28.—The report that Russia offered China a loan on the same terms as Great Britain is confirmed.




