Death of Hon. W. S. Shriver.

The community of Mount Ayr and the people of Ringgold county have suffered deep sorrow during the week, when learning of the death of Hon. W. S. Shriver. He had gained a place in the respect and affections of the people of the county, during his long residence among them, that was in itself peculiar and remarkable. All have been ready and pleased to show him respect when living and moving among them and his death is sincerely lamented.

Mr. Shriver passed away at Ashland, Ohio, among his relatives and friends, on Tuesday, June 19, 1917. He had been in a state of decline for some time and the end was expected. He closed his affairs in this county last autumn and moved to Ohio expecting the end. His relatives had called for him in order that they they might give him brotherly attention. His end was just what might have been expected of a christian life, a peaceful and happy death. The funeral took place from the old home June 23. Mr. Shriver was born in 1845. He came to Ringgold county in 1874 and settled in Benton township, where he engaged in farming. He moved to Mount Ayr in 1894, where he was greatly esteemed as a citizen and a member of the M. E. church. He served as the member of the state legislature for the two terms of 1892-1895. Here he had the respect and confidence of all. He served four years as the president of the county fair association. He was one of the founders of the Ringgold Mutual Insurance Company and the president of the organization for many He served several terms as member of the board of county commissioners and as president of the farmers' institute. In all these positions he served faithfully and well and was always an example of the highest type of honor and usefulness. The county owes him a debt of gratitude and in death lays a wreath of grateful remembrance and affection on his grave. It may be truly said of him as of Barnabas, "For he was a good man and full of the Holy Ghost

W. SHRIVER

was born in Ashland county, Ohio, in 1845 and moved to this county in 1871. Mr. Shriver is of the richest men and owns the neatest and prettiest farms in the west half of the county; 420 acres in one body in northwest Benton. The farm is in a high state of cultivation and is beautifully improved; the handsome farm house, completed in 1874, is 80x80, 2 stories high and the barn on the opposite side of the road from the house, built in 1876, it 54x36 fees in size, besides that sheds have been added since. Mr. Shriver has over 600 rods of osage fiedge which is kept frimmed in familiess style. He has had many years experience in sheep raising and has 212 on the place now, which prove to be very valuable and which he intends increasing. About two cars of hogs and as many of fut cattle leave the farm yearly. He is juite well supplied with various kinds of truit and is a Republican.

MRS. BARBARA BAULZMAN was born in Holmes county, Ohio. In 1813 her parents moved near to Keokuk, Iowa, which, then, was not as large as ML Ayr is to day. In 1859 she married Joseph Saulzman, (her name was Mosier) and since that time she has lived in this county. Her husband died in 1872. owns 220 acres in one farm in east Poe, and lives in the largest and only brick farm house in the county. It is 80 x 35 and 21/2 stories high; it contains over 100,000 brick, was built in 1871 and cost considerably over \$2,500. Mrs. Saulzman and her sons and daughters work hard and the farm shows evidence of their industry; no better crops are seen growing | in the county than on her. farm. Several cars of stock are fed on the place every year. A part of the farm is in the timber and includes running water, making of it an admirable stock farm.

S. A. SPRINGER

was born in Muskingum county, Ohio, in 1848. His mother died before he can remember, and he was bound out to a neighbor, with whom he lived until his death, in 1863. In 1845 his employer moved to Harrison county, Indiana, and in 1852, to Knox county, Ills. He served from Aug., 1861 to Sept., 1862 in the 39th Ills. Inft. In 1875, he moved to this county. From '76 to '79 he lived in Illinois. In 1879 he returned to this county. He lives in Middlefork, and is a Greenbacker.

J. M. SMITH

was born in Jefferson county, Iowa, in 1841. His father, William Smith was an early settler in that county, reaching there in 1831, before the Black Hawk war. Mr. Smith moved to Ringgold county in 1868 and is one of the prosperous men of Clinton; owns 180 acres of improved land in the eastern part of the township; his orchard of 140 fruit trees, is considered the best one in the township. Sells about three cars of fat stock yearly. The farm is nearly enclosed by osage hedges. He is a Democrat

PETER BUITII

is native of County Monaghan, Ireland, and was born in 1850. He came to America in 1854. He lived at Rock Island. Illinois till 74, since which time he has lived in Kinggold county. He owns 96 acres of improved land all under cultivation. He built a good house in 1876. He took his land in a raw state and has it now nicely improved, a good orchard coming on, and no doesn't own a dollor. He is a bachelor as yet, but he has resumed to himself the right to marry on short notice.

a capitalist who has lately moved into the county, was born in Des Moines county, lown, in 1850, and moved to his property in this county in October, 1879. He owns, in one body, 640 acres of land in east Polite has built, since moving here, a fine house and barn, and is having a part of the tract broken out. He will put five cars of steers on the place during the season which will be futted next winter; it is his purpose to handle a great deal of stock in a year or two. A Democrat.

W. S. STEPHENS

was born in Canandaigua county, N. Y, in 1825. In 1837 his people moved to Cleveland; in 1855 his father moved to Bureau county, Mich.; and he moved to this county in 1858. He offered his services in defense of his country in 1861, but was rejected on account of physical disability. Owns 80 acres in southcost Tingley, which he has improved nicely. He is a first-class carpenter but confines himself to his farm since locating in the county. A large orchard and grove are putting in an appearance around his house, and everything speaks of the taste of the owner. He sells some stock year'y, and has been a Republican since the first organization of the party.
