

Former Editor, Legislator Succumbs at Hospital; Was Prominent Mason For Many Years





John Springer was born on November 27, 1850, in Mercersburg, Pennsylvania. He died on March 22, 1937, at Iowa City, Iowa, at the age of eighty-six years.

At an early age Mr. Springer came to Iowa City, Iowa, where he remained until his death. It was here that he established a reputation as a master printer.
