Judge Daniel F. Coyle, 83, of Humboldt, a resident of Humboldt county since 1862, died at his home Wednesday evening of a heart ailment.

Funeral services will be held Saturday afternoon at two o'clock

Daniel Frederick Coyle was born at Avoca, Wisconsin in 1858, and came to a farm eight miles north of Dakota City with his parents when he was four years. He moved into Dakota City in 1864.

Judge Coyle finished school in Dakota City when he was 12 years of age, and did not again attend until he was sixteen. He went to Humboldt college in the fall of 1874, and attended state university at Iowa City in 1876, finishing law school there in 1881.

He returned to Dakota City to practice law, and remained there for five years. In 1882 he was elected mayor of Dakota City. He ran for the legislature in the fall of 1889 on the Republican ticket, was elected, and served one term, declining another nomination. He also practiced law in Fort Dodge

He was elected to the judgeship for this district in 1906, and held this office for 23 years and nine months. He resigned in 1930, and since then had practiced law in Humboldt; he offered free law instructions to students until a short time ago. Many of his pupils are now practicing attorneys. His first graduate was John Cunningham. Judge Coyle was also very active in music, at one time organizing a juvenal bands.

Mr. Coyle was married to Sallie Ham on March 18, 1882 at Springdale, Iowa. She survives him, as do two sons, C. C. Coyle of Humboldt and Claude H., of Kirkland, Washington. A daughter, Margaret Ann, preceded her father in death in 1902. Also surviving are three grandchildren, Frederick of Wilmington, California, Dennis of Burbank, Alaska, and Mrs. Gordener (Mary Ann) of Burt, also two great grandchildren, Sally Ann Gordener, and Fredric Michael Coyle.

Mary Helena Rice Kee

Mary Helena Rice, daughter of James and Elizabeth Rice, was born at Ormstown, Canada, on September 24, 1848, and passed away at Humboldt, Iowa, at nine o'clock p. m., Monday, September 15, 1941, lacking but nine days of reaching her 93rd birthday. She was one of a family of thirteen children. Funeral services were held September 17, 1941.

Her early life was spent at Ormstown and there, on March 3, 1868, she was united in marriage to David Kee. She was the mother of six children, four of whom, Elizabeth, Jemima, William and Albert preceded their mother in death. Surviving are Ida H., Mrs. I. R. Parry of Los Angeles, California, and Iva N., Mrs. A. E. Wittman, of Humboldt, with whom she has resided.

Following their marriage, the young couple came to the United States, settling first at Brandon, Wis., in 1869. It was here that she united with the Congregational church, and continued in that faith throughout her life.

In 1873 they came to Iowa, making the trip to Fort Dodge in a covered wagon. After two years' residence there, they removed to a farm near Gilmore City, where they remained for 37 years, until their retirement in 1908, when they came to Humboldt. She has made her home here since that time, with the exception of two years spent in California following her husband's death. He passed away on Oct. 28, 1926.
