Whole fields of corn are eaten right down to the roots, stalk and all. Corn fields look just like fresh plowed fields. Can't even see the sign of a stalk. And all the gardens are just the same way. Onions, carrots, potatoes and everything eaten right out of the ground.

passed one orchard of about sixty trees and every leaf, and even the small twigs were eaten off. Trees looked worse than they should in January. Luckily the grasshoppers did not come until after the small grain was cut and shocked, so we at least have that."

Another Veteran of Civil War and Pioneer of Odebolt Claimed by Death

Asa B. Smith, another of the early day residents of this community, and a veteran of the war of the rebellion, has answered the last roll call, and passed to the great beyond, after ten years of failing health, and the last six years an invalid. He has been confined to his bed for several years, and the final summons came as a blessed release from suffering.

For the past two weeks it has been known that the days of the aged veteran could not be many, and his son Charles, of this place, was called to his bedside twice. The last time, Friday, the father had gone before Mr. Smith and daughter, Mrs. Runkel, reached Mt. Vernon. Mr. Smith passed away about 6:00 o'clock Friday evening, July 25.

Funeral services were held in Mt. Vernon Sunday afternoon, and the body brought to Odebolt Monday afternoon. Services here were held in the Methodist church at 3:00 o'clock, with the pastor, Rev. J. A. Farnham, in charge.

Comrade Smith was a charter member of Col. Goodrich Post G. A. R. of Odebolt, and members of Col. Goodrich W. R. C. No. 110, attended the service in a body, out of respect to his memory, and in recognition of his services in the civil war. Comrade Henry Meyer of the G. A. R. was present, but Comrade M. D. Fox was unable to be there.

Members of the Roose Post of the American Legion also attended with their colors, and fired the military salute at the grave, and taps were sounded by Commander E. E. Reynolds.

Music for the funeral was furnished by Miss Minnie Kessler, Mrs. John F. Buehler, A. B. Traeder and J. B. Hatch, with Mrs. J. L. Bruce, pianist. One number, "Face to Face", was sung by request.

He moved to DeWitt, Iowa, in 1866, and was married there to Nancy Ellen Mummey, with whom he lived in loving companionship for nearly fifty years.

The family moved to Clinton township in 1878, locating on the farm four miles east of town, which was the family home until after the death of his loved companion sixteen years ago. There he spent a long and active life. Prominent in the G. A. R., prominent in the activities of the Bethel Methodist church, and as a citizen. In 1890 he was elected to serve this county as their representative in the general assembly, and faithfully discharged his duties as a public official. He was "Uncle Asa" to all of his neighbors and friends, and all who knew him well. A staunch christian gentleman, he was always to be found using his influence on the side of right and justice. He was a devoted christian for more than seventy years.

In 1916 he went to Mt. Vernon to make his home with his daughter, Mrs. S. L. Chandler, but came back to visit each summer as long as his health permitted. He has not been able to visit here since the summer of 1924.

He is survived and will be held in loving memory by three children, Charles H. of Odebolt, Mary E. (Mrs. Chandler) of Mt. Vernon, and Harlan A. of Onamia, Minn. He also leaves nine grandchildren, fifteen great grandchildren, three brothers, William, Robert M. and Thomas H., and one sister, Mrs. Edith Thorn of DeWitt.

MR. SPEAKER: Your committee, appointed to prepare resolutions commemorating the life, character and public service of Asa B. Smith, an honored member of the Twenty-third General Assembly, beg leave to submit the following report:

Asa B. Smith was born in Morgan County, Ohio, January 27, 1841. He grew to manhood in Ohio. August 8, 1862, he enlisted in Company C, 97th Ohio Volunteer Infantry, where he served three years. He participated in many major battles, and was severely wounded at Missionary Ridge.

In 1866 he moved to Dewitt, Iowa, where he married Nancy Ellen Mummey, with whom he lived in loving companionship for nearly fifty years. He moved to Sac county in 1878, and settled on a farm east of Odebolt. In 1890 he was elected to the House of Representatives from Sac county, and faithfully discharged his duties as a public official.

In later years he made his home with his daughter at Mt. Vernon, Iowa, where he died July 25, 1930. Three children survive him, Charles H. Smith, Odebolt, Iowa; Mrs. S. L. Chandler, Mt. Vernon, Iowa; and Harlan A. Smith, Onamia, Minnesota.

He was a worthy citizen, a brave defender of his country, and a staunch Christian gentleman, whose influence was always directed towards right and justice in the community where he lived.

Therefore, Be It Resolved that the House of Representatives of the Forty-fourth General Assembly, Take this occasion to express its appreciation of the splendid character and public services of the deceased, and extend to the surviving members of his family its sincere sympathy in their sorrow.

And Be It Further Resolved, That a copy of these resolutions be spread upon the Journal of the House; and that the Chief Clerk be directed to forward a copy to the family of the deceased.

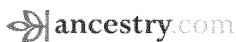

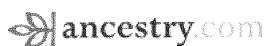

Census takers recorded many details including each person's name, address, relationship to the head of household, color or race, sex, month and year of birth, age at last birthday, marital status, number of years married, the total number of children born of the mother, the number of those children living, birthplace, birthplace of father and mother, if the individual was foreign born, the year of immigration and the number of years in the United States, the citizenship status of foreign-born individuals over age twenty-one, occupation, and more. 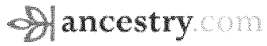

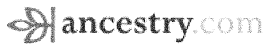

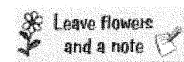
