### HON. HORACE DRAPER A Well Known and Highly Respected Citizen gone to His Reward.

Hon. Horace S. Draper died at his home in Felix township last Friday, March 15, 1895, of paralysis. His death was sudden and was a severe shock to his numerous friends throughout the county. His funeral was conducted Monday and his remains were laid to rest in the Alice cemetery in Melrose township. Many sympathizing friends were present to mourn with his bereaved family in their loss and his place will be vacant at the hearthstone and his familiar face will be missed amongst his associates; but their loss is his gain and his soul is now free from storms and battles of the flesh and his spirit has gone to meet its reward for the deeds of the body. He was one of Grundy county's best and most influential citizens, a kind husband and a loving father, and a warm hearted and honorable man.

Deceased was born near Syracuse, N. Y., October 10, 1834. In 1855 Mr. Draper purchased land in Felix township and that has been his home all the days of his life. He was much attached to his home and friends and sought their companionship and the pleasant influence of his environments rather than the flash and glitter of worldly pleasures. He was a member of the Masonic fraternity and in excellent standing with them.

In 1872 Mr. Draper was married to Miss Mary Allen, a native of New York. To them were born four children—William H., George, Frank and Bertha. The former and latter with the widow survive him. To these we extend our heartfelt sympathy and commend them to the loving care of an all wise and all seeing God who healeth every wound and softens every sorrow.

Mr. Everhart was born in Chester county, Pa., in 1814. In 1855 he removed to Iowa and settled in German twp. on a farm which profession he followed until 1892, when he removed to this city.

The deceased is a highly respected citizen and leaves two sons Wm. Everhart Jr., of Ivyville, Ia., and Henry Everhart of Williams, Ia., and a step-daughter, Mrs. A. E. Stinson, of this place, who have the heart-felt sympathy of the people of this community.

Hon. H. S. Draper died at his home in Felix township March 15, 1895, at the age of 60 years.

Mr. Draper had a partial stroke of paralysis on Sunday March 10, 1895, from which he was relieved the following Friday at 11 o'clock.

The funeral services were held at Alice church Monday, March 18.

Mr. Draper was born in Syracuse N. Y., in 1834, where he resided until he moved to Iowa in 1873 and settled in Felix twp. on a farm of three quarter sections of land which he got from the government at \$1.25 per acre.

Mr. Draper was elected to represent the people of Grundy county in the State Legislature in 1887 and was on several important committees during his term of office.

Mr. Draper has served the county one term as a supervisor.

The deceased leaves a wife, son and daughter and a host of friends who mourn the loss of this loving husband, kind father and esteemed friend.
