BANTA.—At his home in Lamoni, on Tuesday, March 19th, 1889, Mr. Elijah Banta. Funeral services at the Brick chapel at 2 p. m., on Wednesday, Mar. 20th, the sermon being delivered by Elder W. W. Blair. Elder Banta was born in Shelby Co., Ky., Jan. 5 1823. In 1859 he was elected Auditor of Johnson Co., Ind. In 1865 he enlisted for ninety days in the One hundred and Thirty-second regiment of Indiana volunteers. In 1864 he was elected to represent the county of Johnson in the state legislature for a term of two years. In 1883 he was elected to the legislature of Iowa. Elder Banta was for many years a minister of the Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of L. D. S., and in that capacity labored and preached at home and abroad.
